CHAPTER 1: SALVATION

1. Key Verse

• And there is <u>salvation</u>¹ in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among people by which we must be saved [for God has provided the world no alternative for salvation]." <u>Acts 4:12 AMP</u>

Salvation = rescue or safety (physically or morally)

2. Why does one need salvation?

- The soul who sins will die. Ezekiel 18:4 AMP
- The soul who sins shall die. Ezekiel 18:20 NKJV
- <u>the wages of sin *is* death;</u> but the gift of God *is* eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. <u>Romans 6:23 KJV</u>

We will all die physically but the death that is talked about here is spiritual death i.e. eternal separation from God.

3. What is sin?

- All wrongdoing is sin <u>1 John 5:17 AMP</u>
- So for one who knows the right thing to do and does not do it, for him it is sin. James 4:17 AMP

4. Have I sinned?

- all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God Romans 3:23 NIV
- If we say that we have not sinned [refusing to admit acts of sin], we make Him [out to be] a liar [by contradicting Him] and His word is not in us. <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/j.j.gov/10.1001/j.gov

5. What can be done?

• If we [freely] <u>admit</u> that we have sinned <u>and confess</u> our sins, He is faithful and just [true to His own nature and promises], and will forgive our sins and

- cleanse us *continually* from all unrighteousness [our wrongdoing, everything not in conformity with His will and purpose]. <u>1 John 1:9 AMP</u>
- "Repent [change your old way of thinking, turn from your sinful ways, accept and follow Jesus as the Messiah] and be <u>baptized</u>, each of you, in the name of Jesus Christ because of the forgiveness of your sins <u>Acts 2:38 AMP</u>
- "Believe in the Lord Jesus [as your personal Savior and entrust yourself to Him] and you will be saved, you and your household [if they also believe]." Acts 16:31 AMP
- Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord." And you forgave the guilt of my sin. Psalm 32:5 NIV

In simple terms

- 1. Admit you are a sinner (Repent of wrongdoing & confess that you are a sinner to God)
- 2. Believe in the Lord Jesus as your Personal Lord and Savior
- 3. Be Baptised in water

6. When should one turn to GOD?

- Turn to the Lord before it's too late. Call out to him while He's still ready to help you. <u>Isaiah 55:6 NIRV</u>
- For He says, "AT THE ACCEPTABLE TIME (the time of grace) I LISTENED TO YOU, AND I HELPED YOU ON THE DAY OF SALVATION."
 Behold, now is "THE ACCEPTABLE TIME," behold, now is "THE DAY OF SALVATION" 2 Corinthians 6:2 AMP

7. It is GOD's desire that all get saved

- Who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. <u>1</u> <u>Timothy 2:4 NKJV</u>
- the LORD longs to be gracious to you, And therefore He waits on high to have compassion on you. <u>Isaiah 30:18 NASB</u>

8. Jesus able to save us completely

• Therefore He is able also to save to the uttermost (completely, perfectly, finally, and for all time and eternity) those who come to God through Him, since He is always living to make petition to God *and* intercede with Him *and* intervene for them. Hebrews 7:25 AMPC

9. The peril of not accepting GOD's salvation

- How shall we escape [appropriate retribution] if we neglect and refuse to pay attention to such a great salvation [as is now offered to us, letting it drift past us forever]? Hebrews 2:3 AMP
- if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire. Revelation 20:15 NASB

10. Attitude in Praying for forgiveness

But the tax collector, [merely] standing at a distance, would not even lift up
his eyes to heaven, but kept striking his breast, saying, O God, be favorable (be
gracious, be merciful) to me, the especially wicked sinner that I am! I tell you,
this man went down to his home justified (forgiven and made upright and in
right standing with God), rather than the other man; for everyone who exalts
himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted. <u>Luke</u>
18:13-14 AMPC

11. Suggested Prayer - Sinner's Prayer

Almighty God
I confess that I am a sinner.
Please forgive me of all my sins.
I believe that Jesus Christ is Your son.
I believe that He took all my sins upon Himself & that He died and rose again.
I receive Him into my life as my Lord and Saviour.
In Jesus name I pray.
Amen

12. What if I don't "feel" saved after the Sinner's Prayer

• Therefore there is now no condemnation [no guilty verdict, no punishment] for those who are in Christ Jesus [who believe in Him as personal Lord and Savior]. Romans 8:1 AMP

13. What after Sinner's Prayer?

- Water Baptism
 Holy Spirit Baptism
 Spend time with GOD daily i.e. Quiet Time
 Share the gospel(good news) with others i.e. Evangelism

1. Key Verse

I acknowledged my <u>sin</u> to You, And my <u>iniquity</u> I have not hidden. I said, "I will confess my <u>transgressions</u> to the Lord," And You forgave the iniquity of my sin. <u>Psalms 32:5 NKJV</u>

2. What is sin?

- All wrongdoing is sin 1 John 5:17 AMP
- So for one who knows the right thing to do and does not do it, for him it is sin. James 4:17 AMP

3. Sin is primarily against GOD

- **Joseph**: There is no one greater in this house than I, and he has withheld nothing from me except you, because you are his wife. How then could I do this great evil, and <u>sin against God</u>?" <u>Genesis 39:9 NASB</u>
- **David**: Against You, You only, have I sinned And done that which is evil in Your sight Psalm 51:4 AMP
- **GOD to Abimelech**: Then God said to him in the dream, "Yes, I know that in the integrity of your heart you have done this, and <u>I also kept you from sinning against Me</u>; therefore I did not let you touch her. <u>Genesis 20:6 NASB</u>

4. Am I a Sinner?

- <u>all</u> have sinned and fall short of the glory of God <u>Romans 3:23 NIV</u>
- If we say we have no sin [refusing to admit that we are sinners], we delude ourselves and the truth is not in us. [His word does not live in our hearts.] ... If we say that we have not sinned [refusing to admit acts of sin], we make Him [out to be] a liar [by contradicting Him] and His word is not in us. 1 John 1:8,10 AMP

5. Consequences of Sin

1. Spiritual Death

- the wages of sin is death Romans 6:23 KJV
- Then when the illicit desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin has run its course, it gives birth to <u>death</u>. <u>James 1:15 AMP</u>

2. Separation from GOD

• your iniquities have <u>separated</u> you from your God; And <u>your sins have hidden</u> <u>His face from you</u>, So that He will not hear. <u>Isaiah 59:2 NKJV</u>

3. Physical Infirmity

- Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you." John 5:14 NKJV
- Fools, because of their transgression, And because of their iniquities, were afflicted. Psalm 107:17 NKJV
- Cut through *and* make smooth, straight paths for your feet [that are safe and go in the right direction], so that *the leg* which is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather may be healed. <u>Hebrews 12:13 AMP</u>

4. Wilderness

- So the Lord's anger was kindled against the sons of Israel (Jacob) and He
 made them wander in the wilderness forty years, until the entire generation of
 those who had done evil in the sight of the Lord was destroyed. Numbers
 32:13 AMP
- For if you turn back from following Him [completely], He will once again
 leave them in the wilderness, and you will destroy all these people." Numbers
 32:15 AMP

5. Possible errors of judgement

- Then David sent word to Tamar at the palace: "Please go to the house of Amnon your brother and prepare a meal for him." 2 Samuel 13:7 BSB
- But Absalom urged him, so the king sent Amnon and the rest of his sons. 2 Samuel 13:27 BSB

6. Wrath of GOD

• Among these [unbelievers] we all once lived in the passions of our flesh [our behavior governed by the sinful self], indulging the desires of human nature [without the Holy Spirit] and [the impulses] of the [sinful] mind. We were, by nature, children [under the sentence] of [God's] wrath, just like the rest [of mankind]. Ephesians 2:3 AMP

6. Sequence of Sin

• Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God" [for temptation does not originate from God, but from our own flaws]; for God cannot be tempted by [what is] evil, and He Himself tempts no one. But each one is tempted when he is dragged away, enticed and baited [to commit sin] by his own [worldly] desire (lust, passion). Then when the illicit desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin has run its course, it gives birth to death. James 1:13-15 AMP

Example: Adam & Eve

• Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the Lord God had made. He <u>said</u> to the woman, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden'?" And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die." But the serpent 'said to the woman, "You will not surely die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." So when the woman <u>saw</u> that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she <u>took</u> of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate. …[only] from the tree of the knowledge (recognition) of good and evil you shall not eat, otherwise on the day that you eat from it, you shall most certainly <u>die</u> [because of your disobedience]." Genesis 3:1-6 ESV & Genesis 2:17 NASB

Sequence: ¹Temptation + ²Worldly Desire >> 3Commit Sin >> 4Death

• For all that is in the world—the lust *and* sensual craving of the flesh and the lust *and* longing of the eyes and the boastful pride of life [pretentious confidence in one's resources or in the stability of earthly things]—these do not come from the Father, but are from the world. 1 John 2:16 AMP

7. What can be done?

- If we <u>confess</u> our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <u>1 John 1:9 NKJV</u>
- Then I <u>acknowledged</u> my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord." And you <u>forgave the guilt</u> of my sin. Psalm 32:5 NIV

8. Release from Sins

- If we [freely] admit that we have sinned *and* confess our sins, He is faithful and just [true to His own nature and promises], and will forgive our sins and <u>cleanse us continually</u> from all unrighteousness [our wrongdoing, everything not in conformity with His will and purpose]. <u>1 John 1:9 AMP</u>
- To Him who loves us and <u>released</u> us from our sins by His blood <u>Revelation</u> 1:5 NASB
- She will give birth to a Son; and you shall name Him Jesus, for He will <u>save</u>²
 His people from their sins." <u>Matthew 1:21 NASB</u>

9. God can keep us from sinning

- I have kept you from sinning against Me. Genesis 20:6 BSB
- I will give them a heart to know Me, that I *am* the LORD; and they shall be My people, and I will be their God, for they shall return to Me with their whole heart Jeremiah 24:7 NKJV
- I will give them one heart, and I will put a new spirit within them, and take the stony heart out of their flesh, and give them a heart of flesh, that they may walk in My statutes and keep My judgments and do them; and they shall be My people, and I will be their God. Ezekiel 11:19-20 NKJV

10. Attitude towards sin

- A prudent *and* far-sighted *person* sees the evil [of sin] and hides himself [from it], But the naive continue on and are punished [by suffering the consequences of sin]. Proverbs 22:3 AMP
- How then could I do this great evil, and sin against God?" Genesis 39:9 NASB

1. Key Verse

• The Lord is not slack concerning *His* promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that <u>all</u> should come to repentance. <u>2 Peter 3:9 NKJV</u>

1. "Initial" Repentance

- "Repent [change your old way of thinking, turn from your sinful ways, accept and follow Jesus as the Messiah] and be baptized, each of you, in the name of Jesus Christ because of the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. Acts 2:38, 41 AMP/NIV
- He who covers his sins will not prosper, But whoever confesses and forsakes *them* will have mercy. Proverbs 28:13 NKJV

It is this initial repentance that makes one Born Again. See Acts 2:38-41 NKJV

2. Daily Repentance: seeking forgiveness & forsaking evil

- My little children (believers, dear ones), I am writing you these things so that you will not sin *and* violate God's law. And <u>if anyone sins</u>, we have an Advocate [who will intercede for us] with the Father: Jesus Christ the righteous [the upright, the just One, who conforms to the Father's will in every way—purpose, thought, and action]. 1 John 2:1 AMP
- Jesus said to him, "Anyone who has bathed <u>needs only to wash his feet</u>, and is completely clean. And you [My disciples] are clean, but not all of you." <u>John</u> <u>13:10 AMP</u>
- When Simon saw that the Spirit was given through the laying on of the apostles' hands, he offered them money. "Give me this power as well," he said, "so that everyone on whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit." But Peter replied, "May your silver perish with you, because you thought you could buy the gift of God with money! You have no part or share in our ministry, because your heart is not right before God. Repent, therefore, of your wickedness, and pray to the Lord. Perhaps He will forgive you for the intent of

your heart. For I see that you are poisoned by bitterness and captive to iniquity." <u>Acts 8:18-23 BSB</u>

The same Simon who believed earlier (see below) is now asked to repent.

• Then Simon himself also <u>believed</u>; and when he was <u>baptized</u> he continued with Philip, and was amazed, seeing the miracles and signs which were done. <u>Acts 8:13 NKJV</u>

3. Restitution

- Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will <u>pay back</u> four times the amount." Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. <u>Luke 19:8,9 NIV</u>
- Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret. See what this godly sorrow has produced in you: what earnestness, what eagerness to clear yourselves, what indignation, what alarm, what longing, what concern, what readiness to see justice done. <u>2 Corinthians 7:10-11 NIV</u>

4. Bear Fruit

- produce fruit that is consistent with repentance [demonstrating new behavior that proves a change of heart, and a conscious decision to turn away from sin] <u>Matthew 3:8 AMP</u>
- produce fruit that is worthy of [and consistent with your] repentance [that is, live changed lives, turn from sin and seek God and His righteousness]. <u>Luke</u>
 3:8-14 AMP

5. Doing deeds & living lives consistent with repentance

• I openly proclaimed first to those at Damascus, then at Jerusalem and throughout the region of Judea, and *even* to the Gentiles, that they should repent [change their inner self—their old way of thinking] and turn to God, doing deeds *and* living lives which are consistent with repentance. Acts 26:20 AMP

3. Repentance Insights

1. First step in Salvation

"Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. <u>Acts</u>
 2:38 BLB

2. Pathway of Repentance

• Or do you have no regard for the wealth of His kindness and tolerance and patience [in withholding His wrath]? Are you [actually] unaware *or* ignorant [of the fact] that <u>God's kindness leads you to repentance</u> [that is, to change your inner self, your old way of thinking—seek His purpose for your life]? Romans 2:4 AMP

3. Repentance primarily from GOD

 When they heard these things they became silent; and they glorified God, saying, "Then God has also granted to the Gentiles repentance to life." <u>Acts</u> 11:18 NKJV

4. Outcome of Repentance

• So repent [change your inner self—your old way of thinking, regret past sins] and return [to God—seek His purpose for your life], so that your sins may be wiped away [blotted out, completely erased], so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord [restoring you like a cool wind on a hot day] Acts 3:19 AMP

5. People who repented

- David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." And Nathan said to David, "The LORD also has allowed your sin to pass [without further punishment]; you shall not die. 2 Samuel 12:13 AMP
- When word reached the king of Nineveh [of Jonah's message from God], he rose from his throne, took off his robe, covered himself with sackcloth and sat in the dust [in repentance]. <u>Jonah 3:6 AMP</u>
- Now when the king heard the words of the Book of the Law, he tore his clothes. <u>2 Kings 22:11 AMP</u>

CHAPTER 4: WATER BAPTISM

1. Key Verses

- "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Acts 2:38a NIV
- Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved Mark 16:16 NIV

2. Why?

1. Baptism follows believing

• Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved Mark 16:16 NIV

2. Baptism follows repenting

Repent and be baptized <u>Acts 2:38 NIV</u>

3. As the pledge of a clear conscience toward God

• this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ 1 Peter 3:21 NIV

4. As a sign of faithfulness & of being a true believer

And when she was baptized, along with her household, she pleaded with us, saying, "If you have judged me and decided that I am <u>faithful</u> to the Lord [a <u>true believer</u>], come to my house and stay." And she persuaded us. <u>Acts 16:15</u> AMP

3. Who?

• As they continued along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch exclaimed, "Look! Water! What forbids me from being baptized?" [Philip said

- to him, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." And he replied, "I do believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." Acts 8:36-37 AMP
- So then, those who accepted his message were baptized; and on that day about 3,000 souls were added [to the body of believers]. Acts 2:41 AMP

4. When?

As soon as possible after repenting of sins/accepting Christ as Lord and Saviour.

• Now, why do you delay? Get up and be baptized, and wash away your sins by calling on His name [for salvation].' Acts 22:16 AMP

Examples

- **Respondents to Peter's message:** So then, those who accepted his message were baptized; and on that day about 3,000 souls were added [to the body of believers]. Acts 2:41 AMP
- **Ethiopian enuch**: And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" Acts 8:36 ESV
- **Jailer and family**: At that hour of the night, the jailer took them and washed their wounds. And without delay, he and all his household were baptized. Then he brought them into his home and set a meal before them. So he and all his household rejoiced that they had come to believe in God. Acts 16:33-34 BSB
- **Paul**: At that instant, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and his sight was restored. He got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength. Acts 9:18-19 BSB

Respondents to Peter's message – same day Ethiopian eunuch – as soon as he came across some water Jailer and family – before giving the disciples any food Paul – before eating any food (after fasting for 3 days)

5. All who repented & believed got baptised

Examples:

- **Paul**: immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and he regained his sight. Then he rose and was baptized <u>Acts 9:18 ESV</u>
- **Jailor and family**: At that hour of the night, the jailer took them and washed their wounds. And without delay, he and all his household were baptized. Acts 16:33 BSB

• **Cornelius, his relatives and close friends**: he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. <u>Acts 10:48 ESV</u>

6. Anything after Water Baptism?

Yes, receive the Holy Spirit. The same verse that says Repent and be baptised continues as follows:

• And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Acts 2:38b NIV

CHAPTER 5: TONGUES

1. Key Verses

- And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues¹; they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." Mark 16:17-18 NKJV
- I thank God that I speak in [strange] tongues (languages) more than any of you or all of you put together <u>1 Corinthians 14:18 AMPC</u>

2. A Sign Of Receiving The Holy Spirit

- And they were all filled [that is, diffused throughout their being] with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues (different languages), as the Spirit was giving them the ability to speak out [clearly and appropriately]. <u>Acts 2:4</u> AMP
- And when Paul laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they *began* speaking in [unknown] tongues (languages) and prophesying. <u>Acts</u> 19:6 AMP

3. Types of Tongues

1. Different Languages

• And they were all filled [that is, diffused throughout their being] with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues (different languages), as the Spirit was giving them the ability to speak out [clearly and appropriately]... Astounded and amazed, they asked, "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? How is it then that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes, and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism; Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Acts 2:4 AMP & Acts 2:7-11 BSB

2. Unknown Tongues

• For one who speaks in an <u>unknown</u> tongue² does not speak to people but to God; for no one understands him *or* catches his meaning, but by the Spirit he speaks mysteries [secret truths, hidden things]. <u>1 Corinthians 14:2 AMP</u>

• I thank God that I speak in [unknown] tongues more than all of you 1 Corinthians 14:18 AMP

4. When Do You Receive Tongues?

After Water Baptism

 Peter answered them, "Every one of you must repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus the Messiah for the forgiveness of your sins. <u>Then</u> you will receive the Holy Spirit as a gift. <u>Acts 2:38 ISV</u>

Exceptions have happened but those who got Tongues before baptism got baptised immediately afterwards. See below

• While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell on all who were listening to the message. And the believers from among the circumcised [the Jews] who came with Peter were surprised *and* amazed, because the free gift of the Holy Spirit had been bestowed *and* poured out largely even on the Gentiles. For they heard them talking in [unknown] tongues (languages) and extolling *and* magnifying God. Then Peter asked, Can anyone forbid *or* refuse water for baptizing these people, seeing that they have received the Holy Spirit just as we have? And he ordered that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ (the Messiah). Then they begged him to stay on there for some days. Acts 10:44-48 AMPC

5. How Do You Get Tongues?

1. Asking GOD

• If you, then, being evil [that is, sinful by nature], know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask and continue to ask Him!" Luke 11:13 AMP

2. Laying on of hands

- And when Paul laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they *began* speaking in [unknown] tongues (languages) and prophesying. <u>Acts</u> 19:6 AMP
- Then Peter and John <u>laid their hands</u> on them [one by one], and they received the Holy Spirit. <u>Acts 8:17 AMP</u>

6. Wonderfulness of Tongues

• For one who speaks in an <u>unknown</u> tongue does not speak to people but to God; for no one understands him *or* catches his meaning, but by the Spirit he speaks mysteries [secret truths, hidden things]. <u>1 Corinthians 14:2 AMP</u>

To summarise, <u>he who speaks in a tongue speaks to God</u>! How wonderful is that? When we pray in words we may wonder whether God has heard us or not. With tongues we never have to doubt that as we are speaking directly to God.

7. Benefits

1. Builds up- Confirms - Emboldens - Concretes

- One who speaks in a tongue edifies himself; but one who prophesies edifies the church [promotes growth in spiritual wisdom, devotion, holiness, and joy]. <u>1 Corinthians 14:4 AMP</u>
- But you, beloved, build yourselves up [founded] on your most holy faith [make progress, <u>rise like an edifice higher and higher</u>], praying in the Holy Spirit <u>Jude 1:20 AMPC</u>

Edifies = **confirm**, **build(-er, -ing, up)**, **edify**, **embolden**, **concretely** Tongues confirm: Are you wavering? Speak in tongues. Tongues embolden: Do you lack boldness? Speak in tongues.

2. Rest & Refreshing

• No, but [the Lord will teach the rebels in a more humiliating way] by men with stammering lips and another tongue will He speak to this people [says Isaiah, and teach them His lessons]. To these [complaining Jews the Lord] had said, This is the true rest [the way to true comfort and happiness] that you shall give to the weary, and, This is the [true] refreshing—yet they would not listen [to His teaching]. Isaiah 28:11-12 AMPC

See also

• In the law it is written: "With *men of* other tongues and other lips I will speak to this people; And yet, for all that, they will not hear Me," says the Lord. 1 Corinthians 14:21 NKJV

3. Mysteries

• For one who speaks in an [unknown] tongue speaks not to men but to God, for no one understands *or* catches his meaning, because in the [Holy] Spirit <u>he</u> utters secret truths *and* hidden things [not obvious to the understanding]. 1 Corinthians 14:2 AMPC

Nothing is a mystery to GOD. GOD can reveal to us the meaning of the mysteries we speak in tongues. See below

- But the natural [unbelieving] man does not accept the things [the teachings and <u>revelations</u>] of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness [absurd and illogical] to him; and he is incapable of understanding them, because they are spiritually discerned *and* appreciated, [and he is unqualified to judge spiritual matters]. 1 Corinthians 2:14 AMP
- But if there is no one to interpret, the one [who wishes to speak in a tongue] must keep silent in church; let him speak to himself and to God. 1 Corinthians 14:28 AMP

See examples

- Then the mystery was revealed to Daniel in a vision of the night. <u>Daniel 2:19</u>
 ESV
- The king answered Daniel and said, "Most certainly your God is the God of gods and the Lord of kings and a <u>revealer of mysteries</u>, since you have been able to reveal this mystery!" <u>Daniel 2:47 AMP</u>
- And they said to him, "We have [each] dreamed [distinct] dreams and there is no one to interpret them." So Joseph said to them, "Do not interpretations belong to God? Please tell me [your dreams]." Genesis 40:8 AMP

8. Things happening with Tongues

- **Speaking**: But now, brethren, if I come to you <u>speaking</u> with tongues, what shall I profit you unless I speak to you either by revelation, by knowledge, by prophesying, or by teaching? <u>1 Corinthians 14:6 NKJV</u>
- let him who <u>speaks</u> in a tongue pray that he may interpret. <u>1 Corinthians 14:13</u> NKJV
- **Praying**: For if I <u>pray</u> in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my understanding is unfruitful. <u>1 Corinthians 14:14 NKJV</u>
- **Singing**: I will <u>sing</u> with the spirit, and I will also sing with the understanding. <u>1 Corinthians 14:15 NKJV</u>
- **Blessing & Thanksgiving**: For otherwise, if you <u>bless *God*</u> in the spirit *only*, how will the one who occupies the place of the outsider *know to* say the "Amen" at your giving of <u>thanks</u>, since he does not understand what you are saying? <u>1 Corinthians 14:16 NKJV</u>

9. Frequency Of Use

• I thank God that I speak in [strange] tongues (languages) more than any of you or all of you put together <u>1 Corinthians 14:18 AMPC</u>

Implying that he was speaking in Tongues all the time. Possibly the secret of Paul's spirituality and fruitfulness. If GOD uses others more than you, could it not be that they did something more than you that caught His attention?

10. Pray with Tongues & Words

• I will pray with the spirit [by the Holy Spirit that is within me] and I will pray with the mind [using words I understand]; I will sing with the spirit [by the Holy Spirit that is within me] and I will sing with the mind [using words I understand]. 1 Corinthians 14:15 AMP

Pray with tongues alternating with words.

11. Algorithm

Praying in **Tongues** -> Building of **Faith** -> **Command** (Power in Proclamation)

- Tongues & Faith: But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy <u>faith</u>, <u>praying in the Holy Spirit</u>, keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life. <u>Jude 20-21</u> <u>NKJV</u>
- **Faith & Command**: The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" And the Lord said, "If you had <u>faith</u> like4 a mustard seed, <u>you would say</u> to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and be planted in the sea'; and it would obey you. <u>Luke 17:5-6 NASB 1995</u>

See also

- The one who speaks in a tongue builds up himself 1 Corinthians 14:4 BSB
- And Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of him, and the boy was cured instantly. Then the disciples came to Jesus and asked privately, Why could we not drive it out? He said to them, Because of the littleness of your faith [that is, your lack of firmly relying trust]. For truly I say to you, if you have faith [that is living] like a grain of mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, Move from here to yonder place, and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you. But this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting. Matthew 17:18-21 AMPC

12. Next Steps

• Therefore let one who speaks in a tongue pray that he may [be gifted to] translate *or* explain [what he says]. <u>1 Corinthians 14:13 AMP</u>

CHAPTER 7: BORN AGAIN BELIEVER

1. Key Verses

- Jesus answered him, "I assure you *and* most solemnly say to you, unless a person is <u>born again</u> [reborn from above—spiritually transformed, renewed, sanctified], he cannot [ever] see *and* experience the kingdom of God." <u>John</u> 3:3 AMP
- Jesus answered, "I assure you and most solemnly say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit he cannot [ever] enter the kingdom of God. John 3:5 AMP
- Do not be surprised that I have told you, 'You must be <u>born again</u> [reborn from above—spiritually transformed, renewed, sanctified].' <u>John 3:7 AMP</u>

2. Steps to becoming Born Again

- Peter *said* to them, "<u>Repent</u>, and each of you be <u>baptized</u> in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>. <u>Acts 2:38 NASB</u>
- He who <u>believes and is baptized will be saved</u>; but he who does not believe will be condemned. <u>Mark 16:16 NKJV</u>

Not enough to believe just that God exists. See below

• You believe that God is one; you do well [to believe that]. The demons also believe [that], and shudder *and* bristle [in awe-filled terror—they have seen His wrath]! James 2:19 AMP

3. Characteristics of Believers

1. Miracles

- These signs will accompany those who have believed: in My name they will cast out demons, they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up serpents, and if they drink anything deadly, it will not hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will get well." Mark 16:17,18 AMP
- I assure you *and* most solemnly say to you, anyone who <u>believes</u> in Me [as Savior] will also do the things that I do; and he will do even greater things than these [in extent and outreach], because I am going to the Father. <u>John</u> 14:12 AMP

Examples

- God was doing extraordinary *and* unusual miracles by the hands of Paul, so that even handkerchiefs *or* face-towels or aprons that had touched his skin were brought to the sick, and their diseases left them and the evil spirits came out [of them]. Acts 19:11-12 AMP
- And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes of both men
 and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets and laid
 them on cots and mats, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on
 some of them. The people also gathered from the towns around Jerusalem,
 bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all
 healed. Acts 5:14-16 ESV

2. Outflow of the Holy Spirit

• He who believes in Me [who adheres to, trusts in, and relies on Me], as the Scripture has said, 'From his innermost being will flow *continually* rivers of living water." But He was speaking of the [Holy] Spirit, whom those who believed in Him [as Savior] were to receive *afterward*. John 7:38-39 AMP

Examples

 Then Peter and John laid their hands on them [one by one], and they received the Holy Spirit. <u>Acts 8:17 AMP</u>

3. Not Habitually Sin

• We know [with confidence] that anyone born of God <u>does not *habitually*</u> sin; but He (Jesus) who was born of God [carefully] keeps *and* protects him, and the evil one does not touch him. <u>1 John 5:8 AMP</u>

4. Insights

1. Believer becomes a child of GOD!

- For you [who are born-again have been reborn from above—spiritually transformed, renewed, sanctified and] are all <u>children of God</u> [set apart for His purpose with full rights and privileges] through faith in Christ Jesus. For all of you who were baptized into Christ [into a spiritual union with the Christ, the Anointed] have clothed yourselves with Christ [that is, you have taken on His characteristics and values]. <u>Galatians 3:26-27 AMP</u>
- But to as many as did receive *and* welcome Him, He gave the right [the authority, the privilege] to become <u>children of God</u>, *that is*, to those who believe in (adhere to, trust in, and rely on) His name—who were born, not of blood [natural conception], nor of the will of the

flesh [physical impulse], nor of the will of man [that of a natural father], but of God [that is, a divine and supernatural birth—they are born of God—spiritually transformed, renewed, sanctified]. John 1:12-13 AMP

2. Privileges for believers

• Therefore thus says the Lord God: "Behold, My servants shall <u>eat</u>, But you shall be hungry; Behold, My servants shall <u>drink</u>, But you shall be thirsty; Behold, My servants shall <u>rejoice</u>, But you shall be ashamed; Behold, My servants shall <u>sing for joy</u> of heart, But you shall cry for sorrow of heart, And wail for grief of spirit. <u>Isaiah 65:13-14 NKJV</u>

3. Believer-Unbeliever relationship

- Do not be unequally bound together with unbelievers [do not make mismatched alliances with them, inconsistent with your faith]. For what partnership can righteousness have with lawlessness? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness? 2 Corinthians 6:14 AMP
- Blessed is the person who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, Nor stand in the path of sinners, Nor sit in the seat of scoffers! <u>Psalms 1:1 NASB</u>

1. Key Verse

You do not <u>have</u>³ because you do not ask [it of God]. <u>James 4:2 AMP</u>

Have = possession; ability, can(+-not), X conceive, diseased, eat, + enjoy, + fear, + recover, + reign, + rest, + return, X sick

In other words, we do not possess, have ability, enjoy, recover, reign, rest etc because we do not ask. And we are diseased, have fear, are sick etc because we do not ask.

2. GOD hears prayer

- I love the Lord, because <u>He hears My voice</u> and my supplications. <u>Psalm 116:1</u> NASB
- O You who hear prayer, To You all men come. Psalm 65:2 NASB
- The eyes of the LORD *are* on the righteous, And <u>His ears *are open* to their cry. Psalm 34:15 NKJV</u>
- this is the confidence (the assurance, the privilege of boldness) which we have in Him: [we are sure] that if we ask anything (make any request) according to His will (in agreement with His own plan), He listens to and hears us. And if (since) we [positively] know that He listens to us in whatever we ask, we also know [with settled and absolute knowledge] that we have [granted us as our present possessions] the requests made of Him. 1 John 5:14-15 AMPC

3. How our Prayer is to GOD

- the prayer of the upright is His delight⁴. Proverbs 15:8 BSB
- Let my prayer be counted as incense before You Psalm 141:2 AMP
- when He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each having a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. Revelation 5:8 NKJV
- "FOR THE EYES OF THE LORD ARE [looking favorably] UPON THE RIGHTEOUS (the upright), AND HIS EARS ARE <u>ATTENTIVE</u> TO THEIR PRAYER (eager to answer) 1 Peter 3:12 AMP

4. Hinderances to prayer

- your <u>iniquities</u> have separated you from your God; And your <u>sins</u> have hidden His face from you, So that He will not hear. <u>Isaiah 59:2 NKJV</u>
- If I had <u>cherished sin</u> in my heart, the Lord would not have listened <u>Psalm</u> 66:18 NIV 1984

These are not reasons to despair and to not pray. Ask God for forgiveness and then pray. See also

• If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <u>1 John 1:9 NKJV</u>

5. The Prayer GOD Always Hears

There is one prayer that God will always answer: A sinner's repentant prayer; even if it is the vilest sinner!

Examples

• **Ahab**: (There was none who sold himself to do what was evil in the sight of the Lord like Ahab, whom Jezebel his wife incited. He acted very abominably in going after idols, as the Amorites had done, whom the Lord cast out before the people of Israel.) And when Ahab heard those words, he tore his clothes

and put sackcloth on his flesh and fasted and lay in sackcloth and went about dejectedly. And the word of the Lord came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying, "Have you seen how Ahab has humbled himself before me? Because he has humbled himself before me, I will not bring the disaster in his days; but in his son's days I will bring the disaster upon his house." 1 Kings 21:25-29 ESV

• Cain: Cain said to the LORD, "My punishment is greater than I can bear. Behold, this day You have driven me from the face of the earth, and from Your face I will be hidden; I will be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me." "Not so!" replied the LORD. "If anyone slays Cain, then Cain will be avenged sevenfold." And the LORD placed a mark on Cain, so that no one who found him would kill him. Genesis 4:13-15 BSB

God will hear a sinner's prayer for forgiveness

- If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <u>1 John 1:9 NKJV</u>
- Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord." And you forgave the guilt of my sin. Psalm 32:5 NIV

6. Blanket Prayer Promises

- Ask *and* keep on asking and <u>it will be given to you</u>; seek *and* keep on seeking and you will find; knock *and* keep on knocking and the door will be opened to you. For <u>everyone who keeps on asking receives</u>, and he who keeps on seeking finds, and to him who keeps on knocking, it will be opened. <u>Matthew 7:7-8</u> AMP
- If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it. John 14:14 NASB
- whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you. John 16:23 NKJV

7. Answered Prayer source of Joy

• Up to this time you have not asked a [single] thing in My Name [as presenting all that I Am]; but now <u>ask and keep on asking and you will receive, so that your joy (gladness, delight) may be full and complete</u>. <u>John 16:24 AMPC</u>

8. How To Pray

A1. Pray in Advance

Example 1

• **Jesus:** When Jesus saw that a crowd had come running, He rebuked the unclean spirit. "You deaf and mute spirit," He said, "I command you to come out and never enter him again." After shrieking and convulsing him violently, the spirit came out... After Jesus had gone into the house, His disciples asked Him privately, "Why couldn't we drive it out?" Jesus answered, "This kind cannot come out, except by prayer and fasting." Mark 5:25-26,28-29 BSB

Jesus cast out the evil spirit with just a few words. When His disciples asked Him why they could not cast out the evil spirit, His reply would imply that His time in prayer and fasting earlier enabled Him to do what they could not.

Example 2

• Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have <u>heard</u> me. John 11:41 BSB

This passage said in the context of Lazarus being raised from the dead would imply that the Lord Jesus had prayed in advance for him (Lazarus) to be raised from the dead and His getting the assurance before the actual event happened.

Example 3

• In those days Jesus went out to the mountain to pray, and He spent the night in prayer to God. When daylight came, He called His disciples to Him and chose twelve of them, whom He also designated as apostles <u>Luke 6:12-13 BSB</u>

Before choosing His disciples, He spent the night in prayer.

Example 4

- **Nehemiah:** When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven. Nehemiah 1:4 NIV 1984
- The king said to me, "What is it you want?" Then I prayed to the God of heaven, and I answered the king ... It pleased the king to send me; so I set a time.... And because the gracious hand of my God was upon me, the king granted my requests. Nehemiah 2:2-8 NIV 1984

Nehemiah had prayed earlier for a longer period of time, so when the King asked him, he was able to do a quick prayer and make several requests, all of which were granted by the King.

A2. Pray with Agreement

• "Again I say to you, that if two believers on earth <u>agree</u> [that is, are of one mind, in harmony] about anything that they ask [within the will of God], it will be done for them by My Father in heaven. <u>Matthew 18:19 AMP</u>

Examples

- When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and *one* sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Acts 2:1-4 NKJV
- Peter was kept in prison, but earnest prayer for him was made to God <u>by the church</u>... Peter continued knocking, and when they opened, they saw him and were amazed. But motioning to them with his hand to be silent, he described to them how the Lord had brought him out of the prison. <u>Acts 12:5,16-17 ESV</u>

A3. Pray and ...

1. Command

 But Peter put them all out, and knelt down and <u>prayed</u>. And turning to the body he <u>said</u>, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. <u>Acts 9:40 NKJV</u>

2. Do

- **Prayer**: David was told, "Ahithophel [your counselor] is among the conspirators with Absalom." David said, "O Lord, I pray You, turn Ahithophel's counsel into foolishness." <u>2 Samuel 15:31 AMP</u>
- **Doing**: But if you return to the city, and say to Absalom, 'I will be your servant, O king; as I have been your father's servant in the past, so I will be your servant now;' then you can thwart (make useless) the advice of Ahithophel for me. 2 Samuel 15:34 AMP
- **Outcome**: Then Absalom and all the men of Israel said, "The advice of Hushai the Archite is better than that of Ahithophel." For the Lord had ordained to thwart the good advice of Ahithophel, so that the Lord could bring disaster upon Absalom. <u>2 Samuel 17:14 AMP</u>

3. Lay Hands

- And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch, whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid hands on them. Acts 6:5-6 BSB
- They came down and <u>prayed</u> for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit; for He had not yet fallen on any of them; they had simply been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus [as His possession]. Then Peter and John <u>laid their hands on them</u> [one by one], and they received the Holy Spirit. <u>Acts 8:15-17 AMP</u>
- And it happened that the father of Publius lay sick of a fever and dysentery. Paul went in to him and <u>prayed</u>, and he <u>laid his hands on him</u> and healed him. Acts 28:8 NKJV

See also

• These signs will accompany those who have believed: in My name they will cast out demons, they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up serpents, and if they drink anything deadly, it will not hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will get well." <u>Mark 16:17-18 AMP</u>

B1. Pray Believing

- For this reason I am telling you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe (trust
 and be confident) that it is granted to you, and you will [get it]. Mark 11:24
 AMPC
- But without faith *it is* impossible to please *Him*, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and *that* He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. Hebrews 11:6 NKJV

C1. Pray with Confession

- While I was speaking, praying, <u>confessing my sin and that of my people Israel</u>, and presenting my petition before the LORD my God concerning His holy mountain— while I was still praying, Gabriel, the man I had seen in the earlier vision, came to me in swift flight about the time of the evening sacrifice. <u>Daniel 9:20-21 BSB</u>
- please let Your ear be attentive and Your eyes open to hear the prayer of Your servant which I am praying before You, day and night, on behalf of Your servants, the sons (descendants) of Israel (Jacob), <u>confessing</u> the sins of the sons of Israel which we have committed against You; I and my father's house have sinned. <u>Nehemiah 1:6 AMP</u>

C2. Pray with Confidence

- Let us then approach the throne of grace with <u>confidence</u>, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. <u>Hebrews 4:16 BSB</u>
- Beloved, if our heart does not condemn us, we have <u>confidence</u> toward God. And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight. <u>1 John</u> 3:21-22 NKJV
- This is the [remarkable degree of] confidence which we [as believers are entitled to] have before Him: that if we ask anything according to His will, [that is, consistent with His plan and purpose] He hears us. And if we know [for a fact, as indeed we do] that He hears and listens to us in whatever we ask, we [also] know [with settled and absolute knowledge] that we have [granted to us] the requests which we have asked from Him. 1 John 5:14-15 AMP

See examples of those who prayed with confidence

- **David**: The LORD hears *and* responds when I call to Him. Psalm 4:3 AMP
- **Jesus**: I knew that You always hear Me and listen to Me; but I have said this because of the people standing around, so that they may believe that You have sent Me [and that You have made Me Your representative]." John 11:42 AMP

C3. Pray Continually

- pray continually 1 Thessalonians 5:17 NIV
- Now Jesus was telling the disciples a parable to make the point that <u>at all</u> <u>times they ought to pray</u> and not give up <u>and</u> lose heart <u>Luke 18:1 AMP</u>
- Peter therefore was kept in prison: but <u>prayer was made without ceasing</u> of the church unto God for him. <u>Acts 12:5 KJV</u>
- With all prayer and petition pray [with specific requests] at all times [on every occasion and in every season] in the Spirit, and with this in view, stay alert with all perseverance and petition [interceding in prayer] for all God's people. Ephesians 6:18 AMP

Examples of those who prayed continually

- **Apostles**: we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word." <u>Acts 6:4 NKJV</u>
- **Paul**: I thank God that I speak in [unknown] tongues more than all of you <u>1</u> Corinthians 14:18 AMP

E1. Pray bringing your enemies before GOD

- Incline Your ear, LORD, and hear; open Your eyes, LORD, and see; and listen to the words of Sennacherib, which he has sent to taunt the living God.
 2 Kings 19:16 NASB
- And now, Lord, observe their threats [take them into account] and grant that Your bond-servants may declare Your message [of salvation] with great confidence <u>Acts 4:29 AMP</u>

Simile

- And Esther said, If it seems good to the king, let the king and Haman come this day to the dinner that I have prepared for the king. <u>Esther 5:4 AMPC</u>
- And Esther said, "The adversary and enemy *is* this wicked Haman!" So Haman was terrified before the king and queen. <u>Esther 7:6 NKJV</u>

E2. Pray Expectantly

- In the morning, O LORD, You will hear my voice; In the morning I will prepare [a prayer and a sacrifice] for You and watch *and* wait [for You to speak to my heart]. Psalm 5:3 AMP
- he who comes to God must believe that He is, and *that* He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. <u>Hebrews 11:6 NKJV</u>
- "Ask *and* keep on asking and it will be given to you ... For everyone who keeps on asking receives Matthew 7:7-8 AMP
- But know that the LORD has set apart the godly person for Himself; The LORD hears when I call to Him. Psalm 4:3 NASB

F1. Pray with Fasting

- this woman was a widow of about eighty-four years, who did not depart from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day. <u>Luke 2:37</u> NKJV
- Then after fasting and praying, they laid their hands on them [in approval and dedication] and sent them away [on their first journey]. <u>Acts 13:3 AMP</u>
- You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high^a. <u>Isaiah 58:4 NIV</u>

^aThis verse suggests that fasting correctly can get GOD's attention.

F2. Pray Fervently

- The <u>heartfelt</u> and persistent prayer of a righteous man (believer) is able to accomplish much [when put into action and made effective by God—it is dynamic and can have tremendous power]. <u>James 5:16 AMP</u>
- "But now, do indeed <u>plead</u> for God's favor, so that He will be gracious to us. Malachi 1:9 NASB
- Pour out your heart before Him. Psalm 62:8 AMP

To summarise, James 5:16 reads "The heartfelt continued prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective".

Examples

- **Jesus**: And being in agony, He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground. <u>Luke 22:44 NASB</u>
- **Jacob**: Yes, he wrestled with the angel and prevailed; He wept and implored His favor. <u>Hosea 12:4 NASB</u>
- **Hannah**: In her deep anguish Hannah prayed to the Lord, weeping bitterly. ... I was pouring out my soul to the Lord. <u>1 Samuel 1:10,15 NIV</u>
- **The Church (Believers)**: Peter was kept in prison, but the church was <u>fervently</u> praying to God for him. <u>Acts 12:5 BSB</u>

F3. Pray Frequently

- But *Jesus* Himself would <u>often</u> slip away to the wilderness and pray. <u>Luke 5:16</u> NASB
- Now when Daniel knew that the document was signed, he went into his house (now in his roof chamber his windows were open toward Jerusalem); he continued to get down on his knees three times a day, praying and giving thanks before his God, as he had been doing previously. Daniel 6:10 AMP

G1. Pray to GOD The Father

• if you ask <u>the Father</u> for anything in My name, He will give it to you. <u>John</u> <u>16:23 NASB</u>

M1. Pray Much

- Isaac <u>prayed much</u> to the Lord for his wife ... <u>Genesis 25:21 AMPC</u>
- In her bitter distress, Hannah prayed to the LORD and <u>wept with many tears</u>. <u>1 Samuel 1:10 BSB</u>

• Now it was at this time that He went off to the mountain to pray, and He spent the whole night in prayer with God. <u>Luke 6:12 NASB</u>

P1. Pray with Perseverance

- "Ask and keep on asking and it will be given to you ... For everyone who keeps on asking receives Matthew 7:7-8 AMP
- be <u>unceasing and persistent</u> in prayer <u>1 Thessalonians 5:17 AMP</u>
- Now Jesus was telling the disciples a parable to make the point that at all times they ought to pray and not give up and lose heart <u>Luke 18:1 AMP</u>
- as the eyes of servants look to the hand of their masters, As the eyes of a maid to the hand of her mistress, So our eyes look to the Lord our God, <u>Until</u> He has mercy on us. <u>Psalm 123:2 NKJV</u>
- Be unceasing in prayer [praying perseveringly] 1 Thessalonians 5:17 AMP

Examples:

- **Daniel:** At that time I, Daniel, mourned for three weeks. I ate no choice food; no meat or wine touched my lips; and I used no lotions at all until the three weeks were over. <u>Daniel 10:2-3 NIV</u>
- Then he said to me, "Do not be afraid, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart on understanding *this* and on humbling yourself before your God, your words were heard, and I have come in *response to* your words.

 <u>Daniel 10:12 NKJV</u>
- **Elijah:** Ahab went up to eat and drink. But Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; and he bent down to the earth and put his face between his knees. <u>1</u> Kings 18:42 NKJV
- seven times he said, "Go again." Then it came to pass the seventh *time*, that he said, "There is a cloud, as small as a man's hand, rising out of the sea!" So he said, "Go up, say to Ahab, 'Prepare *your chariot*, and go down before the rain stops you.'" 1 Kings 18:43-44 NKJV
- **Persistent widow:** Yet because this widow continues to bother me, I will defend *and* protect *and* avenge her, <u>lest she give me intolerable annoyance</u> and wear me out by her continual coming or at the last she come and rail on me or assault me or strangle me. <u>Luke 18:5 AMPC</u>
- **Syrophoenician woma**n: Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician descent. And she *repeatedly* asked Him to cast the demon out of her daughter. Mark 7:26 NASB

Persevere definition: "continue in a course of action even in the face of difficulty or with little or no indication of success." Reference: Oxford Languages. Link <u>HERE</u>

P2. Pray till Prayed Through

Praying Through refers to praying either till

- 1. you get the assurance that God has heard your Prayer or
- 2. till you get the answer in the physical realm.

In the context of this study, we look at the former i.e. Inner Assurance before Actual Physical event.

Key Verses

- as the eyes of servants look to the hand of their master, as the eyes of a maidservant to the hand of her mistress, so our eyes look to the Lord our God, till He has mercy upon us. Psalm 123:2 ESV
- The LORD hears and responds when I call to Him. Psalm 4:3 AMP
- On the day I called, You <u>answered</u>⁶ me; You made me bold with strength in my soul. <u>Psalm 138:3 NASB</u>
- Leave me, all you who practice injustice, For the Lord has heard the sound of my weeping. The Lord has heard my pleading, The Lord receives my prayer. All my enemies will be put to shame and greatly horrified; They shall turn back, they will suddenly be put to shame. Psalm 6:8-10 NASB
- *But* certainly God has <u>heard</u> *me*; He has attended to the voice of my prayer. <u>Psalm 66:19 NKJV</u>

Example 1

• Lazarus: Now a man named Lazarus was sick... So when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days, and then he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." ... After he had said this, he went on to tell them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep; but I am going there to wake him up." ... Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." ... Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across

the entrance. "Take away the stone," he said. So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me." When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. John 11:1-44 BSB

The above underlined would suggest that Jesus got assurance from God the Father beforehand that Lazarus would be raised from the dead. Could this not be the reason that He stayed back when He heard that Lazarus was sick? i.e. to Pray Through

Example 2

• **Ezra:** And there by the Ahava Canal I proclaimed a fast, so that we might humble ourselves before our God and ask Him for a safe journey for us and our children, with all our possessions. For I was ashamed to ask the king for an escort of soldiers and horsemen to protect us from our enemies on the road, since we had told him, "The hand of our God is gracious to all who seek Him, but His great anger is against all who forsake Him. So we fasted and petitioned our God about this, and <u>He granted our request</u>... We set out from the river Ahava on the twelfth [day] of the first month to go to Jerusalem; and the hand of our God was upon us, and He <u>rescued</u> us from the hand of the enemy and those who lay in ambushes along the way. <u>Ezra 8:21-23 BSB</u> & <u>8:31 AMP</u>

The above passages suggest that Ezra got assurance from God beforehand that they would have a safe journey, though the journey happened only later.

Example 3

• **Hannah:** But Hannah answered and said, "No, my lord, I *am* a woman of sorrowful spirit. I have drunk neither wine nor intoxicating drink, but have poured out my soul before the Lord. Do not consider your maidservant a wicked woman, for out of the abundance of my complaint and grief I have spoken until now." Then Eli answered and said, "Go in peace, and the God of Israel grant your petition which you have asked of Him." And she said, "Let your maidservant find favor in your sight." So the woman went her way and ate, and her face was no longer sad ... So it came to pass in the process of time that Hannah conceived and bore a son, and called his name

Samuel, saying, "Because I have asked for him from the Lord." <u>1 Samuel 1:15-20 NKJV</u>

Hannah "went away" and was "no longer sad" as she knew her prayer had been heard i.e. Prayed Through.

P3. Pray so that Power may be Replenished

- When the woman heard about Jesus, she came up through the crowd behind Him and touched His cloak. For she kept saying, "If only I touch His garments, I will be healed." Immediately her bleeding stopped, and she sensed in her body that she was healed of her affliction. At once Jesus was aware that power had gone out from Him. Turning to the crowd, He asked, "Who touched My garments?" Mark 5:27-30 BSB
- However, the report went around concerning Him all the more; and great multitudes came together to hear, and to be <u>healed</u> by Him of their infirmities.
 <u>So</u>⁸ He Himself *often* withdrew into the wilderness and <u>prayed</u>. <u>Luke 5:15-16</u> NKJV

In the above passages, putting two and two together, one could possibly infer that when people got <u>healed</u>, <u>power</u> left the Lord Jesus which He got replenished through <u>prayer</u>.

P4. Pray while in God's Presence

• On that night <u>God appeared</u> to Solomon, and said to him, "Ask! What shall I give you?" And <u>Solomon said to God: ... Now give me wisdom and knowledge</u>, that I may go out and come in before this people; for who can judge this great people of Yours?" <u>2 Chronicles 1:7-10 NKJV</u>

Simile

- Now it came about on the third day that Esther put on her royal robes and stood in the inner courtyard of the king's palace in front of the king's rooms, and the king was sitting on his royal throne in the throne room, opposite the entrance to the palace. When the king saw Esther the queen standing in the courtyard, she obtained favor in his sight; and the king extended to Esther the golden scepter which was in his hand. So Esther approached and touched the top of the scepter. Then the king said to her, "What is troubling you, Queen Esther? And what is your request? Up to half of the kingdom it shall be given to you." Esther said, "If it pleases the king, may the king and Haman come this day to the banquet that I have prepared for him." Esther 5:1-5 NASB
- So the king and Haman came to dine with Esther the queen. And the king said again to Esther on the second day when wine was being served, What is your petition, Queen Esther? It shall be granted. And what is your request? Even to the half of the kingdom, it shall be performed. Then Queen Esther said, If I have found favor in your sight, O king

and if it pleases the king, let my life be given me at my petition and my people at my request. <u>Esther 7:1-3 AMPC</u>

Esther approaching the King was preceded by

• Then Esther told *them* to reply to Mordecai, "Go, gather all the Jews who are found in Susa, and fast for me; do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. I and my attendants also will fast in the same way. And then I will go in to the king, which is not in accordance with the law; and if I perish, I perish." Esther 4:15-16 NASB

See also

• Therefore let's approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace for help at the time of *our* need. <u>Hebrews 4:16 NASB</u>

Enter GOD's Presence through Worship.

P₅. Pray Prioritising

• Then Daniel returned to his house and explained the matter to his friends Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, urging them to <u>plead</u> for mercy from the God of heaven concerning this mystery, <u>so that Daniel and his friends would not be killed</u> with the rest of the wise men of Babylon. <u>Daniel 2:17-18 BSB</u>

Q1. Pray Quoting GOD's Name

• Asa <u>cried</u>¹⁰ to the Lord his God, "O Lord, there is none like you to help, between the mighty and the weak. Help us, O Lord our God, for we rely on you, and in your name we have come against this multitude. O Lord, you are our God; let not man prevail against you." <u>2 Chronicles 14:11 ESV</u>

Cried = properly address by {name}

E.g. Pray quoting Jehovah Jireh when praying regarding finances.

R1. Pray "Reminding" God

• Then Hezekiah turned his face toward the wall, and prayed to the Lord, and said, "Remember now, O Lord, I pray, how I have walked before You in truth and with a loyal heart, and have done *what is* good in Your sight." And Hezekiah wept bitterly. And the word of the Lord came to Isaiah, saying, "Go

- and tell Hezekiah, 'Thus says the Lord, the God of David your father: "I have heard your prayer, I have seen your tears; surely I will add to your days fifteen years. Isaiah 38:2-5 NKJV
- On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have appointed watchmen; All day and all night they will never keep silent. You who <u>remind</u> the LORD, take no rest for yourselves <u>Isaiah 62:6 NASB 1977</u>

S1. Pray using Scripture Examples

Key Verses:

- For <u>God shows no partiality</u> [<u>no arbitrary favoritism</u>; with Him one person is not more important than another]. <u>Romans 2:11 AMP</u>
- Then Peter began to speak: "I now truly understand that <u>God does not show</u> favoritism <u>Acts 10:34 BSB</u>
- For the LORD your God is the God of all gods, the LORD of all lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who does not show favoritism or take bribes. Deuteronomy 10:17 ISV

Example:

- Lady healed touching hem of His garment: suddenly, a <u>woman</u> who had a flow of blood for twelve years came from behind and touched the <u>hem</u> of His garment. For she said to herself, "If only I may touch His garment, I shall be made well." But Jesus turned around, and when He saw her He said, "Be of good cheer, daughter; your faith has made you well." And the woman was <u>made well</u> from that hour. <u>Matthew 9:20-22 NKJV</u>
- Others healed touching hem of His garment: when the men of that place recognized Him, they sent out into all that surrounding region, brought to Him all who were sick, and begged Him that they might only touch the hem of His garment. And as many as touched it were made perfectly well. Matthew 14:36 NKJV

He healed a lady who touched the hem of his garment. Later on others were healed touching the hem of his garment. What God did for anyone else, He can do for you. Find scripture verses that pertain to what you want that God did for others and ask the same for yourself. See examples below:

- Full Life Span & Health: Moses was one hundred and twenty years old when he died. His eyes were not dim nor his natural vigor diminished. Deuteronomy 34:7 NKJV
- **Deliverence from enemies**: Then David spoke to the LORD the words of this song, <u>on the day when the LORD had delivered him from the hand of all his enemies</u>, and from the hand of Saul. <u>2 Samuel 22:1 NKJV</u>

S2. Pray using Scripture Promises

- **Protection**: The LORD will protect you from all harm Psalm 121:7 HCSB
- **Finances**: He himself shall dwell in prosperity <u>Psalm 25:13 NKJV</u>
- **Healing**: I am the LORD, your healer." Exodus 15:26 ESV

While praying, use promises God has given. See below

• This is the [remarkable degree of] confidence which we [as believers are entitled to] have before Him: that <u>if we ask anything according to His will</u>, [that is, consistent with His plan and purpose] <u>He hears us</u>. And if we know [for a fact, as indeed we do] that He hears *and* listens to us in whatever we ask, we [also] know [with settled and absolute knowledge] that we have [granted to us] the requests which we have asked from Him. <u>1 John 5:14-15 AMP</u>

S3. Pray in Secret

• But as for you, when you pray, go into your inner room, close your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees *what is done* in secret will reward you." Matthew 6:6 NASB

See examples

- And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there. <u>Matthew 14:23</u> NKJV
- And when He had sent them away, He departed to the mountain to pray. Now
 when evening came, the boat was in the middle of the sea; and He was alone
 on the land. Mark 6:46-47 NKJV
- But Jesus Himself would often slip away to the wilderness and pray [in seclusion]. Luke 5:16 AMP
- Now it came to pass in those days that He went out to the mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God. And when it was day, He called His disciples to *Himself*; and from them He chose twelve whom He also named apostles <u>Luke 6:12-13 NKJV</u>

S4. Pray Specifically

• First of all, then, I urge that petitions (<u>specific requests</u>), prayers, intercessions (prayers for others) and thanksgivings be offered on behalf of all people, for kings and all who are in [positions of] high authority, so that we may live a peaceful and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. This [kind of praying] is good and acceptable *and* pleasing in the sight of God our Savior,

- who wishes all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge *and* recognition of the [divine] truth. 1 Timothy 2:1-4 AMP
- With all prayer and petition pray [with <u>specific requests</u>] at all times [on every occasion and in every season] in the Spirit, and with this in view, stay alert with all perseverance and petition [interceding in prayer] for all God's people. <u>Ephesians 6:18 AMP</u>

See examples

- In the days of His earthly life, Jesus offered up both [specific] petitions and [urgent] supplications [for that which He needed] with fervent crying and tears to the One who was [always] able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His reverent submission toward God [His sinlessness and His unfailing determination to do the Father's will]. Hebrews 5:7 AMP
- Then she made a vow and said, "O LORD of hosts, if You will indeed look on the affliction of Your maidservant and remember me, and not forget Your maidservant, but will give Your maidservant a male child, then I will give him to the LORD all the days of his life, and no razor shall come upon his head." ... For this boy I prayed, and the LORD has granted me my request which I asked of Him. 1 Samuel 1:11 NKJV & 1:27 NASB
- He said to them, "Which of you shall have a friend, and go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves <u>Luke 11:5 NKJV</u>

T1. Pray with Tenacity

Examples

- **Shunammite woman:** Now when she came to the man of God at the hill, she <u>caught him by the feet</u>, but Gehazi came near to push her away. But the man of God said, "Let her alone; for her soul *is* in deep distress, and the LORD has hidden *it* from me, and has not told me."...The mother of the boy said, "As *surely as* the LORD lives and you yourself live, I will not leave you." **So** he got up and followed her. <u>2 Kings 4:27 NKJV</u> & <u>4:30 NASB</u>
- **Epaphras:** He is always wrestling in prayer for you, so that you may stand mature and fully assured in the full will of God. Colossians 4:12 BSB
- **Jacob:** Then Jacob was left alone; and a Man wrestled with him until the breaking of day... And He said, "Let Me go, for the day breaks." But he said, "I will not let You go unless You bless me!" Genesis 32:24,26 NKJV

How Jacob wrestled:

- Yes, he struggled with the Angel and prevailed; He wept, and sought favor from Him. <u>Hosea 12:4 NKJV</u>
- Yes, he wrestled with the angel and prevailed; He wept and implored His favor. Hosea 12:4 NASB

T2. Pray with Tongues

- if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays <u>1 Corinthians 14:14 AMP</u>
- I will pray with the spirit [by the Holy Spirit that is within me] <u>1 Corinthians</u> 14:15 AMP
- But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, keep yourselves in the love of God, looking forward to the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to eternal life. <u>Jude 20-21 NASB</u>

W1. Pray with Words & Tongues

• For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my mind is unproductive [because it does not understand what my spirit is praying]. Then what am I to do? I will pray with the spirit [by the Holy Spirit that is within me] and I will pray with the mind [using words I understand]; I will sing with the spirit [by the Holy Spirit that is within me] and I will sing with the mind [using words I understand]. 1 Corinthians 14:14-15 AMP

Pray in your language alternating with tongues.

Y1. Pray Yourself

On hearing this report, King Hezekiah tore his clothes, put on sackcloth, and entered the house of the LORD. And he sent Eliakim the palace administrator, Shebna the scribe, and the leading priests, all wearing sackcloth, to the prophet Isaiah son of Amoz to tell him, "This is what Hezekiah says: ...
 Therefore lift up a prayer for the remnant that still survives." Isaiah 37:1-4
 BSB

In the above verses, King Hezekiah asks Prophet Isaiah to pray. But see verses below:

- So Hezekiah received the letter from the messengers, read it, and went up to the house of the LORD and spread it out before the LORD. And <u>Hezekiah</u> <u>prayed to the LORD</u>: ...
- Then Isaiah son of Amoz sent a message to Hezekiah: "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: <u>Because you have prayed to Me</u> concerning Sennacherib king of Assyria, this is the word that the LORD has spoken against him: ...
- Then the angel of the LORD went out and struck down 185,000 men in the camp of the Assyrians. When the people got up the next morning, there were all the dead bodies! So Sennacherib king of Assyria broke camp and withdrew. He returned to Nineveh and stayed there. One day, while he was worshiping in the temple of his god Nisroch, his sons Adrammelech and Sharezer put him to

the sword and escaped to the land of Ararat. And his son Esar-haddon reigned in his place. <u>Isaiah 37:14-15, 21-22, 36-38 BSB</u>

In the latter verses, Hezekiah prayed to GOD himself (GOD specifically says this when He replies). This resulted in not just Isaiah giving a prophesy but in GOD destroying 185,000 Assyrians.

Read the same account in <u>2 Kings 19 BSB</u> & <u>2 Chronicles 32:20-21 AMP</u> It's good if we can get others to pray for us. Better still if we can pray ourselves.

9. Kinds of Prayer

• Pray in the Spirit at all times, with <u>every kind of prayer</u> and petition. <u>Ephesians 6:18 BSB</u>

As suggested above, there are different kinds of prayer; few examples given below

1. Supplication

• Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and <u>supplication</u>¹¹, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. <u>Philippians 4:6-7 NKJV</u>

Examples

- **Jesus**: In the days of His flesh, He offered up both prayers and <u>supplications</u> with loud crying and tears to the One able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His piety. <u>Hebrews 5:7 NASB</u>
- **Psalmist**: I love the LORD, because He hears [and continues to hear] My voice and my <u>supplications</u>¹² (my pleas, my cries, my specific needs). Psalm 116:1 AMP

2. Groanings

• Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. Romans 8:26 NKJV

3. Intercession

• With all prayer and petition pray [with specific requests] at all times [on every occasion and in every season] in the Spirit, and with this in view, stay alert with all perseverance and petition [interceding in prayer] for all God's people. Ephesians 6:18 AMP

Examples

- **Moses**: Yet now, if You will forgive their sin—but if not, I pray, blot me out of Your book which You have written." Exodus 32:32 NKJV
- **Job**: So now, take seven bulls and seven rams, go to My servant Job, and sacrifice a burnt offering for yourselves. Then My servant Job <u>will pray for you</u>, for I will accept his prayer and not deal with you according to your folly. For you have not spoken accurately about Me, as My servant Job has." <u>Job 42:8 BSB</u>

10. Levels of Prayer

Context: Israelites war against Benjamites. 3 Days – 3 Approaches – 3 Outcomes.

Read full passage: <u>Judges 20:15-35 AMPC</u>

1. Asking

- **Day 1**: The Israelites arose and went up to the house of God [Bethel] and asked counsel of God and said, Which of us shall take the lead to battle against the Benjamites? And the Lord said, Judah shall go up first. Judges 20:18 AMPC
- **Outcome**: The Benjamites came forth out of Gibeah and felled to the ground that day 22,000 men of the Israelites. <u>Judges 20:21 AMPC</u>

Day 1: Defeated by enemies.

2. Supplication

- **Day 2**: And the Israelites went up and <u>wept</u> before the Lord until evening and asked of the Lord, Shall we go up again to battle against our brethren the Benjamites? And the Lord said, Go up against them. <u>Judges 20:23 AMPC</u>
- **Outcome**: And Benjamin went forth out of Gibeah against them the second day and felled to the ground the Israelites again, 18,000 men, all of whom were swordsmen. <u>Judges 20:25 AMPC</u>

Day 2: Defeated by enemies – less casualties. Supplication here implied as meaning prayer with weeping.

3. Supplication + Fasting + Offerings

- **Day 3**: Then all the Israelites, the whole army, went up and came to the house of God [Bethel] and <u>wept</u>; and they sat there before the Lord and <u>fasted</u> that day until evening and offered <u>burnt offerings</u> ¹³ and <u>peace offerings</u> ¹⁴ before the Lord. <u>Judges 20:26 AMPC</u>
- **Outcome**: And the Lord overcame Benjamin before Israel, and the Israelites destroyed of the Benjamites that day 25,100 men, all of whom were swordsmen. <u>Judges 20:35 AMPC</u>

Day 3: Defeated enemies.

Conclusion: It was only when the Israelites went before GOD with Supplication, Fasting & Offerings that they were able to defeat the Benjamites.

Both burnt and peace offerings refer to sacrifices (See superscripts)

Burnt offering = ({**sacrifice**})

Peace offerings = (voluntary) sacrifice in thanks

11. Prayer Combinations

• if My people who are called by My name will <u>humble¹⁴</u> themselves, and <u>pray¹⁵</u> and <u>seek¹⁶</u> My face, and <u>turn¹⁷</u> from their wicked ways, then I will hear

from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land. <u>2 Chronicles 7:14</u> NKJV

- While I was still <u>speaking</u> and <u>praying</u>, and <u>confessing</u> my sin and the sin of my people Israel, and presenting my <u>supplication</u> before the Lord my God in behalf of the holy mountain of my God, while I was still speaking in prayer and extremely exhausted, the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the earlier vision, came to me about the time of the evening sacrifice. <u>Daniel 9:20-21 AMP</u>
- Now while Ezra was <u>praying</u> and <u>confessing</u>, <u>weeping</u> and <u>laying himself face</u> <u>down</u> before the house of God, a very large group from Israel, of men, women, and children, gathered to him, for the people wept bitterly. <u>Ezra 10:1 AMP</u>

12. Prayer Transforms Us

- **Jesus**: As <u>He was praying</u>, the appearance of His face became different [actually transformed], and His clothing *became* white *and* flashing with the brilliance of lightning. <u>Luke 9:26 AMP</u>
- **Moses**: When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the Testimony in his hand, he did not know that the skin of his face was shining [with a unique radiance] because <u>he had been speaking</u> with God. <u>Exodus</u> 34:29 <u>AMP</u>

Jesus's appearance changed as <u>He was praying</u>. We can all pray to God. Moses's face shone because <u>he had been speaking</u> with God.

13. Granted Prayer

For this reason I am telling you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe (trust
and be confident) that it is granted to you, and you will [get it]. Mark 11:24
AMPC

Granted <u>Now</u>. Received <u>Later</u>. So keep on Praying. While praying, use promises God has given. See below

• This is the [remarkable degree of] confidence which we [as believers are entitled to] have before Him: that <u>if we ask anything according to His will</u>, [that is, consistent with His plan and purpose] <u>He hears us</u>. And if we know [for a fact, as indeed we do] that He hears *and* listens to us in whatever we ask, we [also] know [with settled and absolute knowledge] that we have [granted to us] the requests which we have asked from Him. <u>1 John 5:14-15 AMP</u>

The essence of the above passage is that for things we know to be definitely GOD's will e.g. Health, Protection, Prosperity etc, if we pray for these, they are granted to us and by persevering in prayer we can get them.

14. Posture In Prayer

1. Kneeling in Prayer

- Come, let us worship and bow down; Let us <u>kneel</u> before the LORD our Maker. Psalm 95:6 NASB 1977
- When Daniel knew that the document had been signed, he went to his house where he had windows in his upper chamber open toward Jerusalem. He <u>got down on his knees</u> three times a day and prayed and gave thanks before his God, as he had done previously. <u>Daniel 6:10 ESV</u>
- He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and He <u>knelt down</u> and *began* to pray Luke 22:41 NASB
- Peter put them all out, and knelt down and prayed. Acts 9:40 NKJV

2. Lifting up hands in Prayer

- Let my prayer be set before You as incense, The <u>lifting up of my hands</u> as the evening sacrifice. <u>Psalm 141:2 NKJV</u>
- I desire therefore that the men pray everywhere, <u>lifting up holy hands 1</u>
 <u>Timothy 2:8 NKJV</u>

See examples

- So Moses left the city from *his meeting* with Pharaoh, and <u>spread</u> out his hands to the <u>LORD</u>; and the thunder and the hail stopped, and rain no longer poured on the earth. <u>Exodus 9:33 NASB</u>
- As long as Moses held up his hands, Israel prevailed; but when he lowered them, Amalek prevailed. <u>Exodus 17:11 BSB</u>

3. Kneeling and Lifting Hands

- And so it was, when Solomon had finished praying all this prayer and supplication to the LORD, that he arose from before the altar of the LORD, from kneeling on his knees with his hands spread up to heaven. 1 Kings 8:54 NKJV
- at the evening sacrifice I rose from my fasting, with my garment and my cloak torn, and <u>fell upon my knees and spread out my hands</u> to the LORD my God Ezra 9:5 ESV

God will still hear all sincere prayers irrespective of posture. See below

 Then Hezekiah <u>turned his face to the wall and prayed</u> to the LORD <u>Isaiah 38:2</u> NASB

- "O LORD, God of my master Abraham," he <u>prayed</u>, "please grant me success today, and show kindness to my master Abraham. Here I am, <u>standing</u> beside the spring, and the daughters of the townspeople are coming out to draw water. <u>Genesis 24:12-13 BSB</u>
- When I heard these words, I <u>sat down</u> and wept. I mourned for days, fasting and praying before the God of heaven. <u>Nehemiah 1:4 BSB</u>

15. GOD answers even "casual' prayers ...

- Abraham fell facedown. Then he laughed and said to himself, "Can a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Can Sarah give birth at the age of ninety?" And Abraham said to God, "O that Ishmael might live under Your blessing!" But God replied, "Your wife Sarah will indeed bear you a son, and you are to name him Isaac. I will establish My covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his descendants after him. As for Ishmael, I have heard you, and I will surely bless him; I will make him fruitful and multiply him greatly. He will become the father of twelve rulers, and I will make him into a great nation. Genesis 17:17-20 BSB
- I love the LORD, because He hears My <u>voice</u> and my supplications¹⁵. <u>Psalm</u> <u>116:1 NASB 1995</u>

One could say that Abraham was saying this prayer out of frustration. Here David by "voice" is talking about "non intense" prayers; contrast with "supplications" mentioned in the same verse being an example of intense prayer. GOD answers even "casual' prayers especially from those who walk with Him.

16. Reasons for Lack

1. Not Asking

• You do not have 16 because you do not ask. James 4:2 NASB

Luke 15:29 AMP & Luke 15:31 AMP

The above example suggests that the older son could have asked for or taken whatever he needed. Asking is a prerequisite of Heaven. (Matthew 7:11 NASB)

2. Not asking GOD

• They do not cry out to Me from their heart When they wail on their beds [in unbelieving despair] Hosea 7:14 AMP

17. What to Pray

1. "For" GOD

- **GOD Himself**: My heart and my flesh cry out <u>for the living God</u>. <u>Psalm 84:2</u> NKJV
- **Holy Spirit**: If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will *your* heavenly Father give the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to those who ask Him!" <u>Luke 11:13 NKJV</u>

Psalm 84:2 NKJV: Note that here, David is praying "for" God (not "to" God).

2. For Family

- **Spouse**: Isaac pleaded with the Lord for his wife Genesis 25:21 NKJV
- **Children:** "Arise, cry out in the night, at the beginning of the night watches! Pour out your heart like water before the presence of the Lord! Lift your hands to him for the lives of your children **Lamentations 2:19 ESV**

^{+ &}lt;u>recover</u>, + <u>reign</u>, + <u>rest</u>, + <u>return</u>, X <u>sick</u>, take for, + tremble, + uncircumcised, use.

3. For Other things

- **Souls**: Ask of Me, and I will give *You* The nations *for* Your inheritance, And the ends of the earth *for* Your possession. Psalm 2:8 NKJV
- **Good things**: So if you, *despite* being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him! Matthew 7:11 NASB
- **Authorities**: First of all, then, I urge that petitions (specific requests), prayers, intercessions (prayers for others) and thanksgivings be offered on behalf of all people, for kings and all who are in [positions of] high authority, so that we may live a peaceful and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. 1 Timothy 2:1-2 AMP

18. Quick Answer to Prayer

1. While praying

Promise

• It shall also come to pass that <u>before they call, I will answer</u>; and <u>while they are still speaking</u>, I will hear. <u>Isaiah 65:24 AMP</u>

Examples

- **Eliezer**: <u>Before Eliezer had finished speaking (praying)</u>, Rebekah came out with her [water] jar on her shoulder. Rebekah was the daughter of Bethuel the son of Milcah, who was the wife of Abraham's brother Nahor. <u>Genesis 24:15 AMP</u>
- **Daniel**: While I was still speaking and praying, and confessing my sin and the sin of my people Israel, and presenting my plea before the Lord my God in behalf of the holy mountain of my God, while I was still speaking in prayer, the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the vision previously, came to me in my extreme weariness about the time of the evening offering. Daniel 9:20-21 NASB

2. Same day

Promise

• Call on Me in the day of trouble; I will rescue you, and you shall honor *and* glorify Me." Psalm 50:15 AMP

Examples

- **David**: On the day I called, You answered me; And You made me bold *and* confident with [renewed] strength in my life. Psalm 138:3 AMP
- **Samuel**: I will call on the LORD to send thunder and rain, so that you will know and see what a great evil you have committed in the sight of the LORD by asking for a king." So Samuel called to the LORD, and <u>on that day</u> the LORD sent thunder and rain. <u>1 Samuel 12:17-18 BSB</u>
- **Hezekiah**: Then Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed to the LORD, saying, "Please, O LORD, remember how I have walked before You faithfully and with wholehearted devotion; I have done what was good in Your sight." And Hezekiah wept bitterly. Before Isaiah had left the middle courtyard, the word of the LORD came to him, saying, "Go back and tell Hezekiah the leader of My people that this is what the LORD, the God of your father David, says: 'I have heard your prayer; I have seen your tears. I will surely heal you. 2 Kings 20:2-5 BSB
- **Elijah**: Then he prayed again, and the sky poured rain and the earth produced its fruit. <u>James 5:18 NASB</u>
- Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; and he bowed himself down upon the earth and put his face between his knees ... In a little while, the heavens were black with wind-swept clouds, and there was a great rain. 1 Kings 18:42&45 AMPC

Praying for a quick answer

- But I *am* poor and needy; *Yet* the LORD thinks upon me. You *are* my help and my deliverer; <u>Do not delay</u>, O my God. <u>Psalm 40:17 NKJV</u>
- But I *am* poor and needy; Make haste to me, O God! You *are* my help and my deliverer; O LORD, <u>do not delay</u>. <u>Psalm 70:5 NKJV</u>
- A Psalm of David. LORD, I cry out to You; <u>Make haste to me</u>! Give ear to my voice when I cry out to You. <u>Psalm 141:1 NKJV</u>
- O Lord, hear! O Lord, forgive! O Lord, listen and act! <u>Do not delay</u> for Your own sake, my God, for Your city and Your people are called by Your name." <u>Daniel 9:19 NKJV</u>

Key to quick answer to Prayer

And will not [our just] God defend and avenge His elect [His chosen ones] who <u>cry</u> out to Him <u>day and night? Will He delay</u> [in providing justice] on their behalf? I tell you that He will defend and avenge them <u>quickly</u>. However, when the Son of Man comes, will He find [this kind of persistent] faith on the earth?" <u>Luke 18:7-8 AMP</u>

Persistent Fervent Prayer results in Quick Answer to Prayer.

19. Prayer Insights

1. Ask GOD to help you ask

• You ask [God for something] and do not receive it, because you ask with wrong motives [out of selfishness or with an unrighteous agenda], so that [when you get what you want] you may spend it on your [hedonistic] desires. James 4:3 AMP

Example of asking GOD to ask for right things

• The king said to me, "What is it you want?" Then I prayed to the God of heaven, and I answered the king ... It pleased the king to send me; so I set a time.... And because the gracious hand of my God was upon me, the king granted my requests. Nehemiah 2:2-8 NIV 1984

See also

• Now Esther was the daughter of Abihail, the uncle from whom Mordecai had adopted her as his own daughter. And when it was her turn to go to the king, she did not ask for anything except what Hegai, the king's trusted official in charge of the harem, had advised. And Esther found favor in the eyes of everyone who saw her. Esther 2:15 BSB

We need wisdom to ask for the right things.

2. Dare to ask for the "Impossible"

- Is anything too difficult or too wonderful for the Lord? Genesis 18:14 AMP
- 'Oh, Lord GOD! Behold, You Yourself have made the heavens and the earth by Your great power and by Your outstretched arm! Nothing is too difficult for You Jeremiah 32:17 NASB
- For with God nothing [is or ever] shall be impossible." <u>Luke 1:37 AMP</u>

Examples

- **Joshua**: Then Joshua <u>spoke</u> to the Lord on the day when the Lord handed over the Amorites to the sons of Israel, and Joshua said in the sight of Israel, "<u>Sun, stand still at Gibeon, And moon, in the Valley of Aijalon</u>." So the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, Until the nation [of Israel] took vengeance upon their enemies. Is it not written in the Book of Jashar? So the sun stood still in the middle of the sky and was in no hurry to go down for about a whole day. There has not been a day like that before it or after it, when the Lord listened to (heeded) the voice of a man; for the Lord was fighting for Israel. <u>Joshua 10:12-14 AMP</u>
- **Elijah**: Elijah said to her, "Give me your son." So he took him from her arms, carried him to the upper room where he was staying, and laid him on his own bed. Then he cried out to the LORD, "O LORD my God, have You also brought tragedy on this widow who has opened her home to me, by causing her son to die?" Then he stretched himself out over the child three times and cried out to the LORD, "O LORD my God, please let this boy's life return to him!" And the

LORD listened to the voice of Elijah, and the child's life returned to him, and he lived. <u>1 Kings 17:19-22 BSB</u>

This was the first recorded raising of the dead.

These examples demonstrate that you do not need precedence (it having happened before) for God to do something altogether new for you.

3. The Power of One Man's Prayer

- Elijah was a man just like us. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth yielded its crops. James 5:17-18 BSB
- So Jehoahaz pleaded with the Lord, and the Lord listened to him; for He saw the oppression of Israel, because the king of Syria oppressed them. Then the Lord gave Israel a deliverer, so that they escaped from under the hand of the Syrians; and the children of Israel dwelt in their tents as before. 2 Kings 13:4-5 NKJV
- And the Lord said to Moses, "I have seen this people, and indeed it is a stiff-necked people! Now therefore, let Me alone, that My wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them. And I will make of you a great nation." Then Moses pleaded with the Lord his God ... So the Lord relented from the harm which He said He would do to His people. Exodus 32:9-14
 NKJV
- They forgot God their Savior, who did great things in Egypt, wondrous works in the land of Ham, and awesome deeds by the Red Sea. So He said He would destroy them—had not Moses His chosen one stood before Him in the breach to divert His wrath from destroying them. Psalm 106:21-23 BSB

One man's prayer can change a nation's destiny.

4. Devotion to Prayer

- Devote yourselves to prayer <u>Colossians 4:2 NASB</u>
- Be ... devoted to prayer ... Romans 12:10-13 NASB

See examples

- **David**: I am a man of prayer. Psalm 109:4 BSB
- **Paul**: I thank God that I speak in [strange] tongues (languages) <u>more than</u> ¹⁷any of you *or* all of you put together 1 Corinthians 14:18 AMPC
- Apostles: we will <u>devote ourselves to</u> prayer and to the ministry of the word."
 Acts 6:4 NASB

^{15. &}lt;sup>17</sup> This would imply that he was speaking in tongues all the time. Probably the secret of Paul's spirituality and fruitfulness.

• **Anna**: did not depart from the temple, but served *God* with fastings and prayers night and day. <u>Luke 2:37 NKJV</u>

5. House of Prayer

• Then He went into the <u>temple</u> and began to drive out those who bought and sold in it, saying to them, "It is written, 'My house is a house of prayer,' but you have made it a 'den of thieves.' "Luke 19:45-46 NKJV

6. Our body the temple of GOD

 Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? <u>1 Corinthians 3:16 NKJV</u>

7. Pray & see the outcome in the Physical realm

 As long as Moses held up his hands, Israel prevailed; but when he lowered them, Amalek prevailed. <u>Exodus 17:11 BSB</u>

As long as Moses held up his hands (in prayer; see below), Israel saw victory.

 I desire therefore that the men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands <u>1</u> <u>Timothy 2:8 NKJV</u>

8. Journey of Prayer

• At the <u>beginning</u> of your supplications, the command [to give you an answer] was issued, and <u>I have come to tell you</u>, for you are highly regarded *and* greatly beloved. Therefore consider the message and begin to understand the [meaning of the] vision. <u>Daniel 9:23 AMP</u>

See also

• Let my prayer come before You *and* enter into Your presence; Incline Your ear to my cry! Psalm 88:2 AMP

9. Make Time to Pray

- Then King David went in and sat [in prayer] before the LORD <u>2 Samuel 7:18</u>
 AMP
- Now at this time Jesus <u>went off to the mountain to pray</u>, and He spent the whole night in prayer to God. <u>Luke 6:12 AMP</u>

10. Prayer Essential

- Keep watching and praying, so that you do not come into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." Matthew 26:41 NASB
- Moreover, as for me, <u>far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD in ceasing to pray for you</u>; but I will teach you the good and the right way. <u>1</u>
 Samuel <u>12:23 NKJV</u>

11. Prophylactic Prayer

- I do not ask You to take them out of the world, but that You <u>keep them and</u> <u>protect them</u> from the evil one. <u>John 17:15 AMP</u>
- he continued kneeling on his knees three times a day, praying and offering praise before his God, just as he had been doing previously¹⁸. <u>Daniel 6:10</u> NASB

¹⁸ Pray to avoid crisis situations not just if or when crisis situations arise.

CHAPTER 9: FASTING

1. Key Verse

 You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high. <u>Isaiah 58:4 NIV</u>

Suggesting that fasting correctly can get GOD's attention.

2. Why fast?

1. To get GOD's attention

 You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high. Isaiah 58:4 NIV

Examples

- **Daniel:** At that time I, Daniel, mourned for three weeks. <u>I ate no choice food; no meat or wine touched my lips; and I used no lotions at all</u> until the three weeks were over... Then he (the angel) said to me, "Do not be afraid, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart on understanding *this* and on humbling yourself before your God, <u>your words were heard</u>, and I have come in *response to* your words. <u>Daniel 10:2 NIV</u> & 10:12 NKJV
- **Ezra**: So we fasted and sought our God concerning this *matter*, and He listened to our pleading. <u>Ezra 8:23 NASB</u>

2. For stubborn evil spirits to leave

- So He said to them, "This <u>kind</u>¹⁹ can come out by nothing but prayer and fasting." Mark 9:29 NKJV
- But <u>this kind</u> does not go out except by prayer and <u>fasting</u>. <u>Matthew 17:21</u> <u>AMPC</u>

Note, the disciples had been able to cast out evil spirits previously. See below

• And they were casting out many demons and were anointing with oil many who were sick, and healing them. <u>Mark 6:13 AMP</u>

Kind = stock

Mark 9:29 NKJV implies that there different kinds of evil spirits.

3. Reward

when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that it will not be
obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen;
and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. Matthew
6:17-18 NIV

4. Receive power

- Then Jesus, <u>being filled with the Holy Spirit</u>, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, being tempted for forty days by the devil. And <u>in those days He ate nothing</u>, and afterward, when they had ended, He was hungry. <u>Luke 4:1-2 NKJV</u>
- Then Jesus <u>returned in the power of the Spirit</u> to Galilee, and news of Him went out through all the surrounding region. <u>Luke 4:14 NKJV</u>

Note that Jesus went filled but returned in the power of the Holy Spirit.

5. A means of returning to God

• "Yet even now," declares the LORD, "<u>Return</u> to Me with all your heart, And with <u>fasting</u>, weeping, and mourning <u>Joel 2:12 NASB</u>

6. For clarity in decision making & blessing upon decisions

 When they had appointed elders for them in every church, having prayed with fasting, they entrusted them to the Lord in whom they had believed. <u>Acts</u> 14:23 NASB

7. Means of humbling yourself

- <u>Humble</u> yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will <u>lift</u> you up. <u>James 4:10</u> NKJV
- I wept and humbled myself with fasting Psalm 69:10 AMP

- There, by the Ahava Canal, I proclaimed a <u>fast</u>, so that we might <u>humble</u> ourselves before our God and ask Him for a safe journey for us and our children, with all our possessions. Ezra 8:21 NIV
- When Ahab heard these words, he tore his clothes, put on sackcloth, and fasted. He lay down in sackcloth and walked around meekly. Then the word of the LORD came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying: "Have you seen how Ahab has humbled himself before Me? Because he has humbled himself before Me, I will not bring the calamity during his days, but I will bring it upon his house in the days of his son." 1 Kings 21:27-29 BSB

See also

 He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you but to do justly, and to love kindness and mercy, and to humble yourself and walk humbly with your God? Micah 6:8 AMPC

8. To "change" God's mind or any crisis situation

- **Ninevites**: The Ninevites believed God. A <u>fast</u> was proclaimed, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth...Who knows? <u>God may yet relent</u> and with compassion turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish." When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, He relented and did not bring on them the destruction He had threatened. <u>Jonah 3:5 & 9-10 NIV</u>
- Esther & the Jews: "Go, gather together all the Jews who are in Susa, and fast for me. Do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. I and my attendants will fast as you do. When this is done, I will go to the king, even though it is against the law. And if I perish, I perish."... When he saw Queen Esther standing in the court, he was pleased with her and held out to her the gold scepter that was in his hand. So Esther approached and touched the tip of the scepter. Esther 4:16 & 5:2
- **Ahab**: Now when Ahab heard these words [of Elijah], he tore his clothes, put on sackcloth and fasted, and he lay in sackcloth and went about dejectedly (mourning). Then the word of the Lord came to Elijah the Tishbite, saying, "Do you see how Ahab has humbled himself before Me? Because he has humbled himself before Me, I will not bring the evil (catastrophe) in his lifetime, but in his son's days I will bring evil upon his house." 1 Kings 21:27-29 AMP

9. For protection & safety

• There, by the Ahava Canal, I proclaimed a fast, so that we might humble ourselves before our God and ask Him for a <u>safe</u> journey for us and our children, with all our possessions. So we <u>fasted</u> and petitioned our God about this, and He answered our prayer. The hand of our God was on us, and he <u>protected</u> us from enemies and bandits along the way. <u>Ezra 8:21,23,31 NIV</u>

10. Means of worshipping & serving God

She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying.
 Luke 2:37 ESV

11. For Guidance

• Then I proclaimed a fast there, at the river Ahava, that we might humble ourselves before our God to seek from Him a <u>straight and right way</u> for us, our little ones, and all our possessions. <u>Ezra 8:21 AMPC</u>

3. Fasting accompaniments

1. Prayer

- So it was, when I heard these words, that I sat down and wept, and mourned for many days; I was fasting and praying before the God of heaven. Nehemiah 1:4 NKJV
- Then, having fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away. <u>Acts 13:3 NKJV</u>
- When they had appointed elders for them in every church, having prayed with fasting, they entrusted them to the Lord in whom they believed [and joyfully accepted as the Messiah]. Acts 14:23 NKJV

2. Worship

 While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." Acts 13:2 ESV

4. Fasting Insights

1. Fasting a necessity

• But when you fast, put oil on your head [as you normally would to groom your hair] and wash your face so that your fasting will not be noticed by people, but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees [what is done] in secret will reward you. Matthew 6:17-18 AMP

 Jesus said to them, "Can the friends of the bridegroom fast while the bridegroom is with them? As long as they have the bridegroom with them they cannot fast. But the days will come when the bridegroom will be taken away from them, and then they will fast in those days. Mark 2:19-20 NKJV

^aNote, "when" you fast NOT "if" you fast. The above verses would suggest that Fasting is not an option but an essential part of a Believer's life.

2. An entity on its own right

• this woman *was* a widow of about eighty-four years, who did not depart from the temple, but served *God* with fastings <u>and</u> prayers night and day. <u>Luke 2:37 NKJV</u>

Though we often talk about Fasting Prayer, Fasting in its own also is an entity.

3. Hunger during God led fasts

- Moses was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights; he ate no bread and drank no water. Exodus 34:28 AMP
- Then Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where for forty days He was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they had ended, He was hungry. Luke 4:1-2 BSB

4. Examples of "Fast -ers"

- **David**: My knees are unsteady from fasting; And my flesh is gaunt and without fatness. Psalm 109:24 AMP
- **Paul**: But in all *things* we commend ourselves as ministers of God: in much patience, in tribulations, in needs, in distresses, in stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labors, in sleeplessness, in fastings 2 Corinthians 6:4-5 NKJV

5. Lifestyle of fasting

- **Daniel:** Daniel made up his mind that he would not defile himself with the king's choice food or with the wine which he drank <u>Daniel 1:8 NASB</u>
- **Anna the prophetess**: She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. <u>Luke 2:37 BSB</u>

5. Types of Fasting

1. Avoiding food till evening

And when all the people came to persuade David to eat food while it was still
day, David took an oath, saying, "God do so to me, and more also, if I taste
bread or anything else till the sun goes down!" 2 Samuel 3:35 NKJV

2. Avoiding food

• Then Jesus, being filled with the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, being tempted for forty days by the devil. And in those days He ate nothing, and afterward, when they had ended, He was hungry. <u>Luke 4:1-2 NKJV</u>

3. Avoiding food and drink

- "Go, gather all the Jews who are present in Shushan, and fast for me; neither eat nor drink for three days, night or day. My maids and I will fast likewise. And so I will go to the king, which *is* against the law; and if I perish, I perish!" Esther 4:16 NKJV
- So he was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights; he neither ate bread nor drank water. Exodus 34:28 NKJV
- And he caused *it* to be proclaimed and published throughout Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying, Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything; do not let them eat, or drink water. Jonah 3:7 NKJV

4. Other kinds of fasts

- **Daniel**: I ate no pleasant food, no meat or wine came into my mouth, nor did I anoint myself at all, till three whole weeks were fulfilled. <u>Daniel 10:3 NKJV</u>
- **Jesus:** I tell you, I will not drink from this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom." Matthew 26:29 NIV
- He said to them, "I have earnestly wanted to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; for I say to you, I will not eat it again until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." <u>Luke 22:15-16 AMP</u>

6. Starting fasting

• She did what she could. Mark 14:8 NIV

Likewise do what you can. Start small e.g. Start by fasting one meal once a week.

CHAPTER 10: THANKSGIVING

1. Key Verse

• Enter His gates with thanksgiving, *And* His courts with praise. Give thanks to Him; bless His name. Psalm 100:4 NASB 1977

The above suggests thanksgiving as a way to approach GOD.

2. Insights

1. With Prayer

- Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7 NKJV
- Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving <u>Colossians 4:2 NASB</u>

2. Effects

2.1. Honours GOD

• "He who offers a sacrifice of thanksgiving honors Me; And to him who sets *his* way *properly* I will show the salvation of God." Psalm 50:23 NASB

2.2. Pleases GOD

• I will praise the name of God with song And magnify Him with thanksgiving. And it will please the Lord better than an ox Or a young bull with horns and hoofs. Psalm 69:30-31 AMP

3. Always Thankful

• in every situation [no matter what the circumstances] be thankful *and* continually give thanks *to God*; for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. <u>1 Thessalonians 5:18 AMP</u>

1. Key Verse

 You are holy, O You who are enthroned in [the holy place where] the praises of Israel [are offered]. <u>Psalm 22:3 NKJV</u>

2. What happens with praise?

1. Silences the enemy

• From the mouths of children and infants You have ordained <u>praise</u> on account of Your adversaries, to <u>silence</u> the enemy and avenger. <u>Psalm 8:2 BSB</u>

See also

• I am restless in my complaint and am surely distracted, Because of the <u>voice</u> of the enemy, Because of the pressure of the wicked; For they bring down trouble upon me And in anger they bear a grudge against me. My heart is in anguish within me <u>Psalm 55:2-4 NASB</u>

2. Defeats the enemy

• <u>The moment</u> they began their shouts and <u>praises</u>, the LORD set ambushes against the men of Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir who had come against Judah, and they were <u>defeated</u>. <u>2 Chronicles 20:22 BSB</u>

See also

 "Judah, you are the one whom your brothers shall praise; Your hand will be on the neck of your enemies; Your father's sons shall bow down to you. Genesis 49:8 AMP

3. Binds the enemy

• Let the saints be joyful in glory; Let them sing aloud on their beds. *Let* the <u>high praises</u> of God *be* in their mouth, And a two-edged sword in their hand, To execute vengeance on the nations, And punishments on the

peoples; To <u>bind</u> their kings with chains, And their nobles with fetters of iron; To execute on them the written judgment— This honor have <u>all</u> His saints. Psalm 149:5-9 NKJV

See also

 "Assuredly, I say to you, whatever you <u>bind on earth will be bound in heaven</u>, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. <u>Matthew 18:18</u> NKJV

When you praise, evil spirits (referred to as kings and nobles in Psalm 149) get bound. See below

• For we are not wrestling with flesh and blood [contending only with physical opponents], but against the despotisms, against the powers, against [the master spirits who are] the world rulers of this present darkness, against the spirit forces of wickedness in the heavenly (supernatural) sphere. Ephesians 6:12 AMPC

4. Breakthroughs happen

Now about midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns of <u>praise</u> to God, and the prisoners were listening to them; and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's chains were <u>unfastened</u>. <u>Acts 16:25-26 NASB</u>

5. Become filled with the Holy Spirit

• And do not get drunk with wine, in which there is debauchery, but <u>be filled</u> with the Spirit, speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your hearts to the Lord <u>Ephesians</u> 5:18-19 NASB

6. GOD's glory comes down

• The trumpeters and singers joined together to <u>praise</u> and thank the LORD with one voice. They lifted up their voices, accompanied by trumpets, cymbals, and musical instruments, in praise to the LORD: "For He is good; His loving devotion endures forever." And the temple, the house of the LORD, was filled with a cloud so that the priests could not stand there to minister because of

the cloud; <u>for the glory</u>²⁰ <u>of the LORD filled the house of God. 2 Chronicles</u> <u>5:13 BSB</u>

Glory = **properly weight**; **copiousness**

3. Insights

1. Way to approach God

• Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Psalm 100:4 ESV

2. Learn to Praise

 Blessed are those who dwell in Your house! They are ever praising You. <u>Psalm</u> 84:4 NASB

3. Continually Praise

• I will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth. Psalm 34:1 AMP

4. Listening to Praise

 But about midnight, as Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns of praise to God, and the [other] prisoners were listening to them, Suddenly

Why unbelievers don't understand scripture

- The words I have spoken to you are spirit and life [providing eternal life]. John 6:63 AMP
- But the natural [unbelieving] man does not accept the things [the teachings and revelations] of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness [absurd and illogical] to him; and he is incapable of understanding them, because they are spiritually discerned *and* appreciated, [and he is unqualified to judge spiritual matters]. 1 Corinthians 2:14 AMP
- Why do you misunderstand what I say? It is because you are unable to hear what I am saying. [You cannot bear to listen to My message; your ears are shut to My teaching.] You are of your father, the devil, and it is your will to practice the lusts *and* gratify the desires [which are characteristic] of your father. CHAPTER 15: FAITH

1. Definition of Faith

- And what more shall I say? For time will fail me if I tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who by <u>faith [that is, with an enduring trust in God and His promises]</u> subdued kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promised blessings, closed the mouths of lions, extinguished the power of [raging] fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became mighty *and* unbeatable in battle, putting enemy forces to flight. Hebrews 11:32-34 AMP
- Now faith is the assurance (title deed, confirmation) of things hoped for (divinely guaranteed), and the evidence of things not seen [the conviction of their reality—faith comprehends as fact what cannot be experienced by the physical senses]. Hebrews 11:1 AMP

2. Insights

1. Primarily on a Person

• I know Him [and I am personally acquainted with Him] whom I have believed [with absolute trust and confidence in Him and in the truth of His deity], and I am persuaded [beyond any doubt] that He is able to guard that which I have entrusted to Him until that day [when I stand before Him]. 2 Timothy 1:12 AMP

2. Necessary to please GOD

• without faith it is impossible to [walk with God and] please Him, for whoever comes [near] to God must [necessarily] believe that God exists and that He rewards those who [earnestly and diligently] seek Him. Hebrews 11:6 AMP

3. A measure of Faith

• For through the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think more highly of himself than he ought to think; but to think so as to have sound judgment, as <u>God has allotted to each a measure of faith</u>. <u>Romans 12:3 NASB</u>

Henceforth, none of us need think or say that we have no faith.

4. Faith like a Mustard Seed

- And Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of him, and the boy was cured instantly. Then the disciples came to Jesus and asked privately, Why could we not drive it out? He said to them, Because of the littleness of your faith [that is, your lack of firmly relying trust]. For truly I say to you, if you have <u>faith</u> [that is living] like a grain of mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, Move from here to yonder place, and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you. But this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting. <u>Matthew 17:18-21 AMPC</u>
- The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" And the Lord said, "If you had <u>faith like</u>³⁰ a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and be planted in the sea'; and it would obey you. <u>Luke 17:5-6 NASB 1995</u>

We all have been given a measure of faith. Faith that grows like how a mustard seed does can achieve great things.

5. Faith needs to grow

• We ought *and* indeed are obligated [as those in debt] to give thanks always to God for you, brethren, as is fitting, because <u>your faith is growing exceedingly</u> and the love of every one of you each toward the others is increasing *and* abounds. <u>2 Thessalonians 1:3 AMPC</u>

6. Build Faith

1. Through Tongues

- But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, <u>praying in the Holy Spirit</u>, keep yourselves in the love of God, looking forward to the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to eternal life. <u>Jude 20-21 NASB</u>
- He who speaks In a tongue builds up himself. 1 Corinthians 14:4 NKJV

2. Through Prayer & Fasting

• Then the disciples came to Jesus and asked privately, Why could we not drive it out? He said to them, Because of the littleness of your faith [that is, your lack of firmly relying trust]. For truly I say to you, if you have faith [that is living] like a grain of mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, Move from here to yonder place, and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you. But this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting. Matthew 17:18-21 AMPC

Implying that His (Jesus's) faith had grown by prayer and fasting.

7. Contend for the Faith

- Beloved, although I made every effort to write to you about the salvation we share, I felt it necessary to write and urge you to contend³¹ earnestly for the faith entrusted once for all to the saints. Jude 1:3 BSB
- And will not [our just] God defend *and* avenge His elect [His chosen ones] who cry out to Him day and night? Will He delay [in providing justice] on their behalf? I tell you that He will defend *and* avenge them quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will He find [this kind of persistent] faith^a on the earth?" Luke 18:7-8 AMP
- until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ. <u>Ephesians 4:13 NASB</u>

^aIndicative that a person of persistent faith will pray persistently.

8. People who spoke with faith

- Unwell woman: she was saying to herself, "If I only touch His cloak, I will get well." Matthew 9:21 NASB
- **Centurion**: just say the word, and my servant will be healed. Matthew 8:8 NASB

All these got what they believed.

9. Faith places a demand on God

• Mary: And when they ran out of wine, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine." Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does your concern have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Whatever He says to you, do it." Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of purification of the Jews, containing twenty or thirty gallons apiece. Jesus said to them, "Fill the waterpots with

- water." And they filled them up to the brim. And He said to them, "Draw *some* out now, and take *it* to the master of the feast." And they took *it*. When the master of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and did not know where it came from (but the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom. John 2:3-9 NKJV
- **Unwell woman**: a woman was there who had suffered from bleeding for twelve years. She had borne much agony under the care of many physicians and had spent all she had, but to no avail. Instead, her condition had only grown worse. When the woman heard about Jesus, she <u>came up through the crowd behind Him and touched His cloak</u>. For <u>she kept saying</u>, "If only I touch <u>His garments</u>, I will be healed." <u>Immediately her bleeding stopped</u>, and she sensed in her body that she was healed of her affliction. <u>Mark 5:25-29 BSB</u>

By faith you can get what you can believe God for without precedence.

10. Faith without Action dead

• So too, faith by itself, if it does not result in action, is dead. <u>James 2:17 BSB</u>

See examples

• And what more shall I say? For time will fail me if I tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who by faith [that is, with an enduring trust in God and His promises] <u>subdued kingdoms</u>, <u>administered justice</u>, <u>obtained promised blessings</u>, <u>closed the mouths of lions</u>, <u>extinguished the power of [raging] fire</u>, <u>escaped the edge of the sword</u>, out of weakness were made strong, <u>became mighty and unbeatable in battle</u>, putting enemy forces to flight. <u>Hebrews 11:32-34 AMP</u>

11. Faith demands an action

- "Where is your faith?" He asked. <u>Luke 8:25 BSB</u>
- Then Jesus got up and rebuked the wind and the raging waters, and they subsided, and all was calm. Luke 8:24 BSB

12. Take Steps of Faith

• As He came near to Jericho, it occurred that a blind man was sitting by the roadside begging. And hearing a crowd going by, he asked what it meant. They told him, Jesus of Nazareth is passing by. And he shouted, saying, Jesus, Son of David, take pity and have mercy on me! But those who were in front reproved him, telling him to keep quiet; yet he screamed and shrieked so

much the more, Son of David, take pity and have mercy on me! Then Jesus stood still and ordered that he be led to Him; and when he came near, Jesus asked him, What do you want Me to do for you? He said, Lord, let me receive my sight! And Jesus said to him, Receive your sight! Your faith (your trust and confidence that spring from your faith in God) has healed you. And instantly he received his sight and began to follow Jesus, recognizing, praising, and honoring God; and all the people, when they saw it, praised God. Luke 18:35-43 AMPC

Jesus said "Your faith has healed you." See steps of faith the blind man took underlined.

13. Fact x Truth

- **Abraham**: Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as he had been told, "So shall your offspring be." Without weakening in his faith, he acknowledged the decrepitness of his body (since he was about a hundred years old) and the lifelessness of Sarah's womb. Yet he did not waver through disbelief in the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, being fully persuaded that God was able to do what He had promised. Romans 4:18-21 BSB
- **Sarah**: By faith even Sarah herself received the ability to conceive [a child], even [when she was long] past the normal age for it, because <u>she considered</u> Him who had given her the promise to be reliable *and* true [to His word]. Hebrews 11:11 AMP

Faith in spite of knowing the Fact (circumstance) believes the Truth (God and His word). GOD's word is truth. See

• Sanctify them in the truth [set them apart for Your purposes, make them holy]; Your word is truth. John 17:17 AMP

14. Proclamations in Faith

- The centurion answered, "Lord, I am not worthy to have You come under my roof. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed... Then Jesus said to the centurion, "Go! As you have believed, so will it be done for you." And his servant was healed at that very hour. Matthew 8:8,13 BSB
- Then Jesus told him, "<u>Get up, pick up your mat, and walk</u>." Immediately the man was made well, and he picked up his mat and began to walk. <u>John 5:8-9 BSB</u>
- One Sabbath Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues, and a woman there had been disabled by a spirit for eighteen years. She was hunched over and could not stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, He called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your disability." Then He placed His hands on her, and immediately she straightened up and began to glorify God. Luke 13:10-13 BSB

- Then Peter said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk." ... And His name, through faith in His name, has made this man strong, whom you see and know. Yes, the faith which *comes* through Him has given him this perfect soundness in the presence of you all. Acts 3:6,16 NKJV
- In Lystra there sat a man crippled in his feet, who was lame from birth and had never walked. This man was listening to the words of Paul, who looked intently at him and saw that he had faith to be healed. In a loud voice Paul called out, "Stand up on your feet!" And the man jumped up and began to walk. Acts 14:8-10 BSB

15. One word in Faith enough for a Miracle

• But Peter said, "I do not have silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you: In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, walk!" Acts 3:6 NASB

16. Faith has the highest place among our weapons of warfare

• <u>above all, taking the shield of faith</u> with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. <u>Ephesians 6:16 NKJV</u>

17. Focus on Jesus: Author & Perfector of Faith

• Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses [who by faith have testified to the truth of God's absolute faithfulness], stripping off every unnecessary weight and the sin which so easily *and* cleverly entangles us, let us run with endurance *and* active persistence the race that is set before us, [looking away from all that will distract us and] focusing our eyes on Jesus, who is the Author and Perfecter of faith [the first incentive for our belief and the One who brings our faith to maturity], who for the joy [of accomplishing the goal] set before Him endured the cross, disregarding the shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God [revealing His deity, His authority, and the completion of His work]. Hebrews 12:1-2 AMP

CHAPTER 16: EVANGELISM

1. Key Verse

• He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach³² the gospel to every creature. Mark 16:15 NKJV

Preach = as a public crier

Evangelism: "The action or work of spreading the Christian gospel by public preaching or by giving personal testimony about the experience of conversion" Oxford English Dictionary

2. Insights

1. Focus of Evangelism

• What then? Only *that* in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, <u>Christ is preached</u>; and in this I rejoice, yes, and will rejoice. <u>Philippians 1:18 NKJV</u>

2. Be active in evangelising

- I pray that you may be <u>active in sharing your faith</u>, so that you will have a full understanding of every good thing we have in Christ. <u>Philemon 1:6 NIV 1984</u>
- Woe to me if I do not <u>preach the gospel! 1 Corinthians 9:16 NIV</u>
- Rescue³³ those being led away to death, and restrain those stumbling toward the slaughter. If you say, "Behold, we did not know about this," does not He who weighs hearts consider it? Does not the One who guards your life know? Will He not repay a man according to his deeds? <u>Proverbs 24:11-12 BSB</u>

Be active in sharing the gospel i.e. Evangelism

3. Who to evangelise to?

- **Family**: One of the two who heard what John said and [as a result] followed Jesus was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first looked for and found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" (which translated means the Christ). Andrew brought Simon to Jesus. John 1:40-42 AMP
- Now therefore, please swear to me by the LORD that you will indeed show kindness to my family, because I showed kindness to you. Give me a sure sign that you will spare the lives of my father and mother, my brothers and sisters, and all who belong to them, and that you will deliver us from death." Joshua 2:12-13 BSB
- **City**: The woman then left her waterpot, went her way into the city, and said to the men, "Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did. Could this be the Christ?" Then they went out of the city and came to Him. <u>John</u> 4:28-30 NKJV
- **World**: He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach³⁴ the gospel to every creature. Mark 16:15 NKJV
- To those who have not heard of Christ: Accordingly I set a goal to preach the gospel, not where Christ's name was already known, so that I would not build on another man's foundation; but [instead I would act on this goal] as it is written [in Scripture], "They who had no news of Him shall see, And they who have not heard [of Him] shall understand." Romans 15:20-21 AMP

4. Ultimate purpose of evangelism

• He shall see the labor of His soul, *and* be satisfied. By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, For He shall bear their iniquities. <u>Isaiah</u> 53:11 NKJV

That Christ may be satisfied, that his suffering has yielded the desired result i.e. salvation of souls.

5. Evangelism similes

• Then they said to one another, "We are not doing the right thing. This day is a day of good news, but we are keeping silent *about it;* if we wait until the

- Finally, the servant who had received the one talent came and said, 'Master, I knew that you are a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered seed. So I was afraid and went out and hid your talent in the ground. See, you have what belongs to you.' 'You wicked, lazy servant!' replied his master. 'You knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered seed. Then you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received it back with interest. Matthew 25:24-27 BSB

Read the story: 2 Kings 7:3-9 ESV

6. How often do you evangelise?

- I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always offering prayer with joy in my every prayer for you all, in view of your sharing in the preaching of the gospel from the first daya until now. Philippians 1:3-5 NASB
- Proclaim the good news of His salvation from day to day. <u>Psalm 96:2 NKJV</u>

See also

 And the Lord kept adding to their number <u>daily</u> those who were being saved. Acts 2:47 AMP

aFirst day = Day of Salvation (day got saved)

7. Consequence of unsaved not accepting the Gospel

- He will <u>punish those who</u> do not know God and <u>do not obey the gospel</u> of our Lord Jesus. <u>2 Thessalonians 1:8 NIV</u>
- Whoever believes *and* has decided to trust in Him [as personal Savior and Lord] is not judged [for this one, there is no judgment, no rejection, no condemnation]; but the one who does not believe [and has decided to reject Him as personal Savior and Lord] is judged already [that one has been convicted and sentenced], because he has not believed *and* trusted in the name of the [One and] only begotten Son of God [the One who is truly unique, the only One of His kind, the One who alone can save him]. John 3:18 AMP

8. Unbelievers blinded to the Gospel

• The god of this age (the devil) has blinded³⁵ the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. <u>2 Corinthians 4:4 NIV</u>

9. Preach The Full Gospel

- Peter said to them, "<u>Repent</u> and be <u>baptized</u> every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the <u>gift of the</u> <u>Holy Spirit</u>. <u>Acts 2:38 ESV</u>
- Then Philip began with this very Scripture and told him the good news about <u>Jesus</u>. As they traveled along the road and came to some water, the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is there to prevent me from being <u>baptized</u>?" And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. <u>Acts 8:35-36 BSB</u>
- after he brought them out [of the inner prison], he said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" And they answered, "Believe in the Lord Jesus [as your personal Savior and entrust yourself to Him] and you will be saved, you and your household [if they also believe]." And they spoke the word of the Lord [concerning eternal salvation through faith in Christ] to him and to all who were in his house. And he took them that *very* hour of the night and washed their *bloody* wounds, and immediately he was <u>baptized</u>, he and all his *household*. Acts 16:30-33 AMP

The Full Gospel at its very minimum includes

- 1. Repentance & asking GOD for forgiveness
- 2. Believing in the Lord Jesus as personal Savior
- 3. Baptism (Water)

Jesus never tried to sweet talk people into accepting the gospel. See <u>Luke 14:36</u> & Matthew 19:21 & Matthew 13:34

10. Benefits to those who preach the Gospel

- Rescue those who are being taken away to death, And those who stagger to the slaughter, Oh hold them back [from their doom]! If you [claim ignorance and] say, "See, we did not know this," Does He not consider it who weighs *and* examines the hearts *and* their motives? And does He not know it who guards your life *and* keeps your soul? And will He not repay [you and] every man according to his works? Proverbs 24:11-12 AMP
- Then the wise will <u>shine</u> like the brightness of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness will <u>shine</u> like the stars forever and ever. <u>Daniel 12:3</u> BSB
- I pray that you may be active in sharing your faith, so that you will have a full
 understanding of every good thing we have in Christ. Philemon 1:6 NIV 1984

11. Power in the Gospel

- I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the <u>power</u> of God for salvation [from His wrath and punishment] to everyone who believes [in Christ as Savior], to the Jew first and also to the Greek. Romans 1:16 AMP
- For our gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Spirit and in much assurance ... <u>1 Thessalonians 1:5 NKJV</u>

12. Preaching the Gospel with Signs (Miracles)

• And they went out and preached everywhere, the Lord working with *them* and confirming the word through the accompanying signs. Mark 16:20 NKJV

Examples

- And my speech and my preaching were not with persuasive words of human wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power <u>1 Corinthians 2:4</u> NKJV
- For our gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Spirit and in much assurance, as you know what kind of men we were among you for your sake. <u>1 Thessalonians 1:5 NKJV</u>

13. Evangelism & Healing

 So they departed and went through the towns, preaching the gospel and healing everywhere. <u>Luke 9:6 NKJV</u> • But the crowds were aware *of this* and followed Him; and He welcomed them and *began* speaking to them about the kingdom of God, and curing those who had need of healing. <u>Luke 9:11 NASB</u>

14. Anointing: Means of effective evangelism

- "The Spirit of the Lord *is* upon Me, Because He has anointed Me To preach the gospel to *the* poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to *the* captives And recovery of sight to *the* blind, *To* set at liberty those who are oppressed; To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord." Luke 4:18-19 NKJV
- "The Spirit of the Lord GOD *is* upon Me, Because the LORD has anointed Me To <u>preach good tidings</u> to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, To proclaim liberty to the captives, And the opening of the prison to *those who are* bound <u>Isaiah 61:1 NKJV</u>

15. Effective Evangelism Examples

- Then <u>all who lived at Lydda and the plain of Sharon</u> saw [what had happened to] him, and they turned to the Lord. <u>Acts 9:35 AMP</u>
- And this became known throughout all Joppa, and <u>many came to believe on</u> the Lord [to adhere to and trust in and rely on Him as the Christ and as their Savior]. Acts 9:42 AMPC
- On the next Sabbath almost the <u>entire city</u> gathered together to hear the word of the Lord [about salvation through faith in Christ]. <u>Acts 13:44 AMP</u>
- So then, those who accepted his message were baptized; and on that day about 3,000 souls were added [to the body of believers]. Acts 2:41 AMP
- But many of those who heard the message [of salvation] believed [in Jesus and accepted Him as the Christ]. And the <u>number of the men came to be</u> about 5,000^a. Acts 4:4 AMP
- On the next Sabbath almost the entire city gathered together to hear the word of the Lord [about salvation through faith in Christ]. **Acts 13:44 AMP**

Above examples mostly following Miracles.

Ways Of Preaching the Gospel

1. Testimony

 Many of the Samaritans from that town <u>believed in him because of the</u> woman's testimony, "He told me everything I ever did." <u>John 4:39 NIV</u>

- For you will be His witness to all men <u>testifying</u> of what you have seen and <u>heard</u>. Acts 22:15 AMP
- For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard." <u>Acts 4:20</u> <u>NKJV</u>

2. Scripture

- Many more <u>believed because of His word John 4:41 NASB</u>
- from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. <u>2 Timothy 3:15</u> NKJV
- The seed is the word of God. The seeds along the path are those who hear, but the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. Luke 8:11-12 BSB
- he said, 'Then I beg you, father, that you send him to my father's house— for I have five brothers—in order that he may warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.' But Abraham said, 'They have Moses and the Prophetsa; let them hear them.' But he said, 'No, father Abraham, but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent!' But he said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophetsb, they will not be persuaded even if someone rises from the dead." Luke 16:27-31 NASB 1995

1. Key Verse

Under Fig Tree – Place for Prayer & Meditation <u>Reference</u>

2. Why?

1. Appointment with GOD

- Do two men walk together <u>unless</u> they have made an appointment? <u>Amos 3:3</u>
 NASB 1995
- Enoch <u>walked with God</u>; and he was not [found among men], because God took him [away to be home with Him]. <u>Genesis 5:24 AMP</u>

"Quiet Time" – an appointment With God & a means of walking with God.

2. Means of Daily Spiritual Food

- Then the LORD said to Moses, "Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you; and the people shall go out and gather a day's portion every day, so that I may test them, whether or not they will walk in My instruction. <u>Exodus 16:4 NASB</u>
- But He answered and said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.' "Matthew 4:4 NKJV
- But Jesus answered him, saying, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.'" <u>Luke 4:4 NKJV</u>

3. When?

Any fixed time e.g. early in the morning.

- In the <u>morning</u>, O LORD, You will hear my voice; In the <u>morning</u> I will prepare [a prayer and a sacrifice] for You and watch *and* wait [for You to speak to my heart]. <u>Psalm 5:3 AMP</u>

1. Confession

- If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. <u>1 John 1:9 NIV</u>

2. Thanksgiving

 Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise <u>Psalm 100:4</u> NIV

3. Praise & Worship

- From the mouths of children and infants You have ordained <u>praise</u> on account of Your adversaries, to silence the enemy and avenger. <u>Psalm 8:2 BSB</u>
- Come, let us worship and bow down; Let us kneel before the LORD our Maker. Psalm 95:6 NASB 1977
- you will seek³⁶-Me and find³⁷ *Me*, when you search for Me with all your heart. Jeremiah 29:13 NKJV

In other words, when one worships God with all their heart, God's Presence appears i.e. one has an Encounter with God. Read: <u>WORSHIP</u>. Sing one or several songs. If you can't sing, listen to songs. Remember, GOD is not after your eloquence but after your heart. See

5. Bible

Spend some time reading the Bible. Choose any book you like to read. For example, read a chapter of Proverbs (Proverbs 22 on 22nd; Total Chapters = 31), 5 Psalms a day (5/day x 30 days = 150 = Total number of Psalms), a small epistle e.g. Philippians.

6. Make "Quiet Time" a Habit

- **Moses**: Now Moses <u>used to take his own tent</u> and pitch it outside the camp, far away from the camp, and he called it the tent of meeting [of God with His own people]. And everyone who sought the LORD would go out to the [temporary] tent of meeting which was outside the camp. **Exodus 33:7 AMP**

7. How Long?

- Then He came to the disciples and found them sleeping, and said to Peter, "What! Could you not watch with Me one hour? <u>Matthew 26:40 NKJV</u>
- Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the ninth *hour*, the hour of prayer. <u>Acts 3:1 NASB</u>

• Cornelius said, "Four days ago to this hour, I was praying in my house during the ninth hour (3:00-4:00 p.m.); and a man [dressed] in bright, dazzling clothing suddenly stood before me Acts 10:30 AMP

Spend some time with God daily. It doesn't matter if you start with just 5 minutes daily as long as you do it consistently.

CHAPTER 18: GOD'S WILL

1. Key Passage

• For this reason we also, since the day we heard *about it*, have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be <u>filled with the knowledge of His will</u> in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you will <u>walk in a manner worthy of the Lord</u>, to <u>please *Him*</u> in all respects, <u>bearing fruit</u> in every good work and <u>increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all power</u>, according to His glorious might, <u>for the attaining of all perseverance and patience</u>; <u>joyously giving thanks</u> to the Father, who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. <u>Colossians 1:9-12 NASB</u>

2. GOD's Generic Will

1. Salvation

• Who wants everyone to be <u>saved 1 Timothy 2:4 BSB</u>

2. Sanctification

• For this is the will of God, that you be <u>sanctified</u> [separated and set apart from sin] 1 Thessalonians 4:3 AMP

3. Thanksgiving

• Thank [God] in everything [no matter what the circumstances may be, <u>be</u> <u>thankful and give thanks</u>], for this is the will of God for you [who are] in Christ Jesus [the Revealer and Mediator of that will]. <u>1 Thessalonians 5:18 AMPC</u>

3. Find out GOD's Will

- "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven. Matthew 7:21

 AMP
- Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the <u>will of the Lord is. Ephesians 5:17 NKJV</u>

- Therefore I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies [dedicating all of yourselves, set apart] as a living sacrifice, holy and well-pleasing to God, *which is* your rational (logical, intelligent) act of worship. And do not be conformed to this world [any longer with its superficial values and customs], but be transformed *and* progressively changed [as you mature spiritually] by the renewing of your mind [focusing on godly values and ethical attitudes], so that you may prove [for yourselves] what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His plan and purpose for you]. Romans 12:1-2 AMP
- And try to learn [in your experience] what is pleasing to the Lord [let your lives be constant proofs of what is most acceptable to Him]. Ephesians 5:10
 AMPC

4. Knowing GOD's Will

1. Spending time with GOD

• Then the LORD said to Moses, "Come up to Me on the mountain and stay here, so that I may give you the tablets of stone, with the law and commandments I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with Joshua his attendant and went up on the mountain of God... When Moses went up on the mountain, the cloud covered it, and the glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai. For six days the cloud covered it, and on the seventh day the LORD called to Moses from within the cloud... Moses entered the cloud as he went up on the mountain, and he remained on the mountain forty days and forty nights. Then the LORD said to Moses, "Tell the Israelites to bring Me an offering. You are to receive My offering from every man whose heart compels him. And they are to make a sanctuary for Me, so that I may dwell among them. You must make the tabernacle and design all its furnishings according to the pattern I show you. Exodus 24:12-18 BSB & 25:1-9 BSB

2. Worship & Fasting

• While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, Separate now for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them. Acts 13:2 AMP

5. GOD's Will revealed clearly

1. Moses

- According to all that I show you, *that is*, the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of all its furnishings, just so you shall make *it*. Exodus 25:9 NKJV
- And see to it that you make *them* according to the pattern which was shown you on the mountain. <u>Exodus 40:16 NKJV</u>

2. David

- He gave him the plans of all that the Spirit had put in his mind for the courts of the temple of the LORD and all the surrounding rooms, for the treasuries of the temple of God and for the treasuries for the dedicated things. 1 Chronicles
 28:12 NIV
- All *this,* "said David, "the LORD made me understand in writing by His hand upon me, all the work *and* details [to be done] according to this plan." 1 Chronicles 28:19 AMP

6. Do GOD's Will

- "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who <u>does</u> the will of My Father who is in heaven. <u>Matthew 7:21</u>

 AMP
- For whoever <u>does the will</u> of My Father who is in heaven, he is My brother, and sister, and mother." <u>Matthew 12:50 NASB</u>
- And that servant who knew his master's will, and yet <u>did not get ready or act in accord with his will</u>, will be beaten with many lashes [of the whip], but the one who did not know it and did things worthy of a beating, will receive only a few [lashes]. From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and to whom they entrusted much, of him they will ask all the more. <u>Luke 12:47-48 AMP</u>

7. Persevere in GOD's Will

 You need to persevere so that when you have done the will of God, you will receive what He has promised. <u>Hebrews 10:36 NIV 1984</u>

8. When you don't know GOD's Will

• Then the LORD said to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the Israelites to move on. Exodus 14:15 NIV

9. GOD will guide you into His Will

- the LORD will guide you continually and satisfy your desire in scorched places and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail. <u>Isaiah 58:11 ESV</u>
- whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear ³⁸ this command³⁹ behind you: "This is the way. Walk in it." <u>Isaiah 30:21 BSB</u>

10. Settling for less than GOD's Will

• Now the sons of Reuben and the sons of Gad had very large herds of cattle, and they saw the land of Jazer and the land of Gilead [on the east side of the Jordan River], and indeed, the place was suitable for raising livestock ... They said, "If we have found favor in your sight, let this land be given to your servants as a possession. Do not take us across the Jordan [River]." Numbers 32:1,5 AMP

GOD's Will = His best for us. GOD's plan/promise/will for the Israelites was the land of Canaan (Exodus 6:4) across the Jordan (Deuteronomy 11:31) a land flowing with Milk and Honey (Exodus 3:8) where one cluster of grapes had to be carried between two people on a pole! (Numbers 13:23). However, seeing a land on the way that was suitable for livestock, some Israelites chose that over GOD's will!

See also

- Now those who say such things show that they are seeking a country of their own. If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. Instead, they were longing for a better country, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He has prepared a city for them. Hebrews 11:14-16 BSB
- By faith Moses, when he was grown, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's
 daughter. He chose to suffer oppression with God's people rather than to
 experience the fleeting enjoyment of sin. He valued disgrace for Christ above
 the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking ahead to his reward. Hebrews 11:24-26 BSB
- For whatever was written in earlier times was written for our instruction, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope *and* overflow with confidence in His promises. Romans 15:4 AMP

11. Doing GOD's Will unknowingly

- Roll your works upon the Lord [commit and trust them wholly to Him; He will cause your thoughts to become agreeable to His will, and] so shall your plans be established *and* succeed. Proverbs 16:3 AMPC
- For it is [not your strength, but it is] God who is effectively at work in you, both to willa and to work [that is, strengthening, energizing, and creating in you the longing and the ability to fulfill your purpose] for His good pleasure. Philippians 2:13 AMP

aHe gives us the desire and strengthens us to do His will. In other words, when you are in tune with God, you automatically do His will even without consciously knowing. See below
